

## Escalator works at Chancery Lane station

WORK starts today to refurbish two of the escalators at Chancery Lane, meaning there will be no down escalator service to the westbound platform.

Customers using the station are advised to allow extra time for their westbound journey as access to the platform will be via a fixed staircase.

At peak times, crowd control measures may see westbound passengers being asked to wait before going down to the platform to avoid overcrowding.

## Reduced lift service at Mornington Crescent

THERE will be a reduced lift service at Mornington Crescent Underground station from today as work begins to repair one of the two that lead to the lower concourse.

The work is expected to run until Sunday. During this time passengers are asked to walk along the passageway and use the staircase, which has 66 steps.  
On Sunday Camden Town station is exit

only from 1pm until 5.30pm. Customers should use Chalk Farm or Kentish Town stations for the Northern lines and avoid using Mornington Crescent station if possible. Customers are advised to allow additional time for their journeys.

An essential for train enthusiasts, this box set contains two motorised cars and two trailer cars, which are crafted on the new Metropolitan line S Stock trains built by Bombardier in Derby. With each model built to a 1:76 scale, they are compatible with standard model railways and accessories.

**Newgate Club wristwatch, £149**

This stylish timepiece has a stainless steel face and a contrast canvas strap with leather backing. Water resistant to 30 metres, it comes with a choice of straps – black and grey or red and blue.

**Bicycle pizza cutter, £16.99**

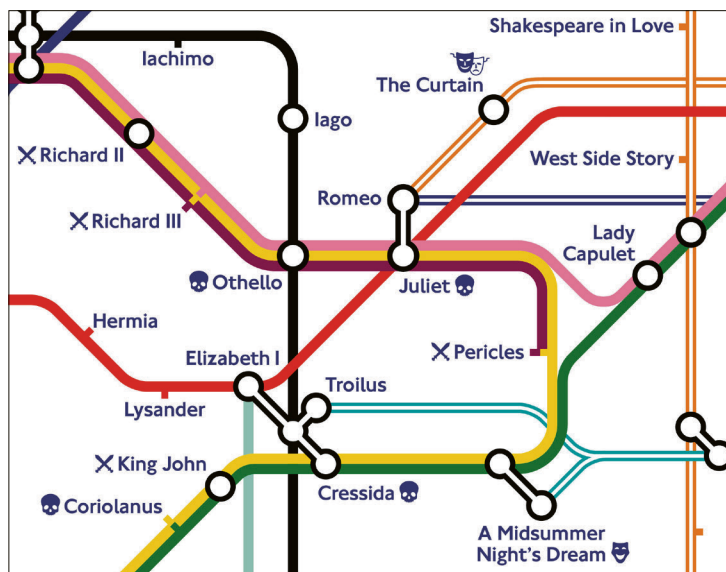
