## London Overground

**Sunday:** No service between Camden Road and Stratford after 10.15pm. Use local bus or rail replacement bus services.

**Sunday:** No service between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Junction after 10pm. A rail replacement bus service will run.

**Sunday:** No service between Wandsworth Road and Clapham Junction. Use local bus services.

## Part closures on the London Overground and Bakerloo line

FROM tomorrow until December 23, there is a part closure on London Overground services between Euston and Watford Junction, and on the Bakerloo line between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone. This is so that Network Rail can work on the track and infrastructure.

Bakerloo line and London Overground customers should use local bus routes to connect to alternative rail options, including the nearby Metropolitan and Jubilee lines.

Alternatively, additional bus routes 718, 719 and 720 will run between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone as well as between Harrow & Wealdstone and Watford Junction.

Customers for central London can use London Northwestern Railway services that run between Euston and Wembley Central, Harrow & Wealdstone, Bushey or Watford Junction.

## Hop on a bus this Christmas

GET your Christmas shopping sorted by riding the bus for just £1.65, taking advantage of the Mayor's Hopper fare to make unlimited bus and tram journeys within one hour of touching in.

Some of London's most famous shopping destinations can be visited within an hour. For a single bus fare, shoppers could hop from Covent Garden to Oxford Street via route 98, followed by a ride on route 94 to get to the Notting Hill boutiques, with the added bonus of antique shops on Portobello Road Market only a short walk away.

Five buses wrapped with a festive twist are now in operation across the capital to bring a smile to Londoners and visitors during winter. The eye-catching red and white buses are covered with snowflakes,

## Strike advice this weekend

PLANNED national rail strike action will be taking place today and tomorrow. Most TfL services, including the majority of the Tube, will continue to run, but there will be disruption on the London Overground, the Elizabeth line and parts of the Bakerloo, Circle and District lines.

Services will still be disrupted during the early morning peak on Sunday but a good service should be running by late morning.

Strike action is also planned by Abellio bus drivers today and tomorrow, which will mostly impact bus routes in west and south London.

## Getting home safely

AS we approach Christmas and New Year's Eve, TfL has relaunched its annual Safer Travel at Night campaign.

While London's public transport network provides a safe, affordable and sustainable way to travel around at night, TfL is also reminding Londoners of how to safely use taxis and minicabs.

If a minicab is not booked, it's illegal and unsafe. Booking a minicab through a licensed operator means that there is a record of the journey, driver and vehicle used, so if there are any problems then the driver can be traced.

Black cabs are different to minicabs and do not need to be pre-booked – they can be approached on the street or at taxi ranks.

They can also be booked in advance through an app, phone or online. If passengers experience any behaviour from a taxi or private hire driver that makes them feel uncomfortable, they can report it by dialling 999 if it is an emergency, or by calling 101.

Over the next few weeks, TfL and the police will be stepping up their activity to crack down on unbooked minicabs and other illegal activity by targeting priority locations across the capital.

They will also be speaking directly to minicab operators to remind them of their responsibilities towards passenger safety.
