WORKSHOPS ON CREATING A GREENER FUTURE AT LONDON TRANSPORT MUSEUM

LONDON Transport Museum's interactive Green Journey installation is now open for families to enjoy. This summer, little ones can join workshops to learn about big concepts, and follow a green-themed trail to see how we can tackle climate change in the capital.

Visitors can wander through four themed, hands-on areas to learn about topics such as global warming and its effects on London, the solutions from big businesses that are already under way to help tackle it – such as TfL's hydrogen buses – as well as new green jobs.

CHALLENGE LITTLE ONES

There are several workshops throughout the summer, suitable for children aged eight to 14 years old.

These will kick off with Climate Calling, where youngsters can learn about how climate change affects London and the crucial role transport can play in providing a solution. They can then put it all into practice by creating a Climate Calling board game.

Swing by the museum in August for a Future Innovators workshop, where you'll hear about inspiring climate change innovators, and delve into what jobs will exist in the future. Don't miss out on the chance to construct your own climate change superhero.

Find out how you can make small, daily changes to help tackle climate change in the final workshop, Activate.

Families can also create individual Family Action Cards to keep everyone motivated to being greener when they return home.



Olden days: See buses and trains from 200 years of transport history

There will be five workshops each day, on selected dates, with Climate Calling running from now until August 4; Future Innovators from August 6 to August 18; and Activate from August 20 to September 1.

TECH WORKSHOPS

On August 3-4, the museum will also be hosting Mastercard's Girls4Tech STEM workshops in the main gallery. Children can drop into sessions on Cryptology and Big Data, learning through fun, problem-solving games.

The Girls4Tech workshops will be run by Mastercard staff, looking to inspire the next generation to pursue a STEM career.

The Green Journey installation is part of the museum's 18-month climate action programme, Climate Crossroads, which is supported by Mastercard, Mott MacDonald, Cubic Transportation Systems and Sopra Steria.

Other highlights at the museum include vintage buses and Tube trains, and the popular All Aboard play zone, aimed at children aged up to seven years. With its mini-fleet of iconic London vehicles for little ones to climb aboard, it's the perfect pit stop.

There is also the opportunity to explore historic vehicles, get hands-on in the Future Engineers gallery and, in the Digging Deeper gallery, see a life-size recreation of the huge tunnelling shield that helped create the world's first electric Tube railway.

Adult tickets cost £21, which lets you visit as many times as you like within a year during the daytime. Children aged 17 and under go free. £1 tickets are also available to visitors receiving Universal Credit and Pension Credit.

Rail strikes planned for this week

CUSTOMERS are advised that, while they will still be able to travel during planned national rail industrial action this week, they should check before they travel.

The RMT and ASLEF unions are planning to take industrial action this Wednesday and Saturday respectively, which will impact some TfL services. While the industrial action doesn't involve TfL staff,

some disruption is expected on the Bakerloo and District lines, London Overground, and the Elizabeth line, which all share some sections of track with Network Rail. The majority of TfL's other services will run on Wednesday as usual.
