

Plan your weekend travel

Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Edgware Road and Aldgate (via Victoria) owing to the testing of new signalling equipment, and track and drainage replacement work at Aldgate. A ten-minute service will operate between Hammersmith and Aldgate only. Use alternative Tube lines and/or local buses.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Embankment and West Ham owing to track and drainage replacement work at Aldgate, and Crossrail construction work at Whitechapel. Replacement buses will call at: Tower Hill – Aldgate and Aldgate East – Whitechapel – Stepney Green – Mile End – Bow Road – Bromley-by-Bow – Canning Town (for the Jubilee line and DLR).

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Liverpool Street and Barking owing to the testing of new signalling equipment, and Crossrail construction work at Whitechapel. Replacement buses will run. See the District line entry for details.

DLR

Part closure

All weekend: no services between Bow Church and Stratford owing to Crossrail work at Pudding Mill Lane. Use local buses.

London Overground

Part closure

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/ Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

All weekend: trains will not stop at Whitechapel owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local buses between Shoreditch High Street and Shadwell via all reasonable routes.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Sunday: no service on the line owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018.

Replacement buses will run between Gospel Oak and Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham and Victoria line), and between Walthamstow Central (for the Victoria line) and Barking. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road, or Tube services between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

TfL Rail

Part closure

Saturday: no service between Liverpool Street and Stratford owing to Network Rail track work and station improvements, and Crossrail construction work. Use the Central line.

Changes to travel at Seven Sisters

PASSENGERS using Seven Sisters station may need to allow extra time for their journey from next week while maintenance work is carried out on one of the escalators.

From Monday until mid-August, customers using the Victoria line will not be able to leave the station from the Seven Sisters Road ticket hall or use it to change trains for the London Overground.

People will be directed via the High Road ticket hall and either leave the station there or follow signs along the street to the Seven Sisters Road entrance for London Overground services. It is about a five-minute walk.

Customers should touch out at the High Road exit and then touch back in at Seven Sisters Road to make sure they are charged the correct fare.

A down escalator won't be affected by the works so passengers can still use the Seven Sisters Road entrance to catch Victoria line trains or change from London Overground on to the Victoria line.

The work is part of TfL's Tube modernisation plan and has been scheduled to take place over the summer when there are no football matches at the Spurs stadium nearby, to keep disruption to a minimum.

Celebrate Eid in Trafalgar Square

JOIN thousands of Londoners and visitors at Trafalgar Square on Sunday to celebrate the end of Ramadan.

The event, organised by Mayor of London Sadiq Khan, will include plenty of family-friendly activities including storytelling, art workshops and face-painting. There will also be music from around the world, market stalls to browse and traditional cuisine to try.

The free event runs from midday to 6pm. The area will be busy, so people are advised to get there using public transport. The nearest station is Charing Cross.

Night Tube arrives at Charing Cross

CHARING Cross Tube station will open for Night Tube services from tonight.

Night Tube services will help the thousands of people who live, work and socialise in the area, and will take the pressure off surrounding stations including Leicester Square and Embankment.

The service has been made possible thanks to a recent upgrade of the station, in particular the Northern line ticket hall, which has been completely overhauled.

Customers using Night Tube services should enter and exit the station using the two staircases in Villiers Street at the junction with the Strand.
