3809 The Minutes of the Board Meeting held on the 7<sup>th</sup> May 1925 were confirmed and signed.

3810 The Secretary and Treasurer reported receipt of apologies for absence from Mr Cater Scott.

Traffic situation

3811 The Chairman in reviewing the traffic situation indicated that there had been no changes worthy of mention since the previous meeting of the Board, that he expected the immediate publication of a second order under the London Traffic Act 1924 which would have the effect of further limiting the number of omnibuses, that a public enquiry would probably be held before confirmations of the Order, further that enquiry was being made by the Police at the present time as to individual routes

and as to the sufficiency of the traffic facilities thereupon. That in the meantime the associated Tramway Companies were having a very trying experience.

#### Provisional Monthly Results

- 3812 The Comptroller and Accountant submitted statement showing the Provisional Monthly Results for the four months to the 30<sup>th</sup> April 1925 compared with the corresponding period of the previous year, which was received. The Chairman indicated the estimated result of the operations of the Companies to the end of May.

#### Cash Statement

- 3813 The Secretary and Treasurer submitted Cash Statement (No 121) from the 28<sup>th</sup> April to the 26<sup>th</sup> May 1925 showing a debit balance on current accounts of £345,2,,11 Treasury Bills £310,000 and other Investments £272,990,,11,,0

Also submitted Cash Statement (No 28) in respect of the New Works Account for the same period showing a credit balance on current accounts of £3,600,,13,,9

Deposit Account £400,000 Treasury Bills £260,000 and other investments £2,038,391.

It was resolved that the Cash Statements be received and that the drawing of cheques since the date of the last Board Meeting be and the same is hereby approved and confirmed.

- 3814 Capital Statement

A Statement showing the Capital position of the Company was submitted.

- 3815 Capital Requisitions

The Secretary and Treasurer submitted Capital Requisitions for approval as follows:-

It was resolved that the Requisitions be and the same are hereby approved and the expenditure charged to Capital.

### Traffic Receipts

3816 The Assistant Managing Director submitted Statement of traffic receipts from the 1<sup>st</sup> January to the 30<sup>th</sup> May 1925 compared with the corresponding period of the previous year, which was received, and discussed generally the development of local traffic in London since 1919, indicating that statistics showed the continual growth of travel, but considerable changes in the relative positions of the several forms of transport, that while the omnibuses were growing ground both Railways and Tramways were losing ground.

3817 Legal and Parliamentary

### King's Cross Interchange Line

Also reported that the draft Order in this matter had been lodged with the Ministry of Transport and duly advertised, that Agreements had been completed with the Metropolitan Railway, the London Midland & Scottish Railway, the Metropolitan Water Board, and the St Pancras Borough Council, and that Agreements had been settled with the London and North Eastern Railway and the London Country Council.

### Supply of electricity to Chiswick Works of the London General Omnibus Company Ltd

Also submitted supplemental Agreement between the Company, the Metropolitan District Railway Company and the London General Omnibus Company Ltd in regard to the supply of electric current to the Chiswick Works of the last named Company, under which it was proposed that the price of current supplied should be 1 ¼d per unit

based upon coal at 30/ per ton in place of 2d per unit based on coal at 45/per ton as specified in the Principal Agreement, and that the sum of £400 payable by the Railway Companies to the local electricity undertakers should be included in the 1 ¼ d per unit.

It was resolved that the Supplemental Agreement be and the same is hereby approved so far as this Company is concerned, and authority given for the Seal of the Company to be affixed thereto.

### 3818 Accidents and Claims

Further reported as to Accidents and claims in connection with the Operating Companies, that there had been 15 fatal accidents during May and 56 for the five months to the end of May 1925 compared with 18 and 72 respectively in the corresponding periods of 1924 – that accidents generally had decreased 19% per 100,000 car miles run during May, and 21% per 100,000 car miles run for the five months to the end of May compared with the similar periods of 1924, that to the end of May, 22 Claims cases had been contested in the Courts the Companies being successful in all cases save two, that for the five months to the end of May there had been 4 fatal Staff accidents, against none in the same period of 1924.

### 3819 Report from Panel of Directors for Receipts and Payments (No36)

Also submitted a Report from the Panel of Directors for Receipts and Payments (No 36) which was received.

### 3820 Reports from Directors of Construction and Officers

The Chairman called upon the Assistant Managing Director report progress made with the New Works mentioning that Mr Knapp, the Director of Construction was absent owing to the death of his wife.

The Operating Manager verbally reported with regard to the Edgware Extension that there was a considerable growth of residential accommodation in the district which should react favourably upon the Company's traffic.

The Company and the Metropolitan Water Board Agreement as to interchange line at Kings Cross.

The Metropolitan Railway Company and the Company Grant of easement to construct a single tube under the Metropolitan Company's railway and works in the Euston Road.

The Company and Messrs J Elias and P. H. Edwards Conveyance of plot of land situate on Southern side of Highfield Avenue, Golders Green.

The Company to the Well Fire & Foundry Co Ltd Licence to assign premises No 178 York Road Islington.
