## Night at the Museum

London Transport Museum will open its doors after hours this Friday to launch its new exhibition, **The Prize for Illustration 2017: Sounds of the City.**

At the Friday Late event, guests can get creative during 'make-and-take' workshops, listen to talks and join a curated mini-tour of the exhibition. There will also be a bar, in-house DJ and a music-themed quiz.

The exhibition will showcase 100 illustrations chosen from the art and design world for the prestigious Prize for Illustration, which is organised by London Transport Museum in partnership with the Association of Illustrators. Themes include wildlife, nightlife, music, markets, transport and sport. The winning design will be announced

this month and displayed as a poster on the Underground network.

Other event highlights include a talk with BBC Radio 4's Word of Mouth and historical language expert Dr Laura Wright; face painting designs, including the famous Bowie Zig Zag; and a 'design a postcard' activity illustrating sound through watercolour.

Crumbs City Trails are a fun way to explore London and get the recommended amount of exercise (20 minutes a day) for the week.


The app takes you on a route scattered with clues and trivia questions to help you discover more about the culture and history of your local area.
