

# Plan ahead for the weekend

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines this weekend. There are also no planned works on TfL Rail or London Trams. However, engineering and improvement work will affect the following services:

## Circle line

## Full closure

**Sunday:** There will be no service throughout the line for modernisation work. Use alternative Tube lines or buses.

## District line

## Part closure

**Sunday:** No service between High Street Kensington and Edgware Road for modernisation work. Use local buses instead.

## Hammersmith & City line

## Part closure

**Sunday:** No service between Hammersmith and Moorgate for modernisation work. Use local buses.

## Metropolitan line

## Part closure

**Sunday:** No service between Wembley Park and Aldgate for modernisation work. Use Jubilee line services between Wembley Park and Baker Street or Chiltern Railway services between Marylebone and Harrow-on-the-Hill.

## DLR

## Part closure

**Saturday and Sunday:** No service from Westferry to Island Gardens and Poplar to Canary Wharf while track work takes place. Rail replacement buses will operate:

- Westferry – Canary Wharf – Heron Quays – South Quay – Crossharbour – Mudchute – Island Gardens

## London Overground

## Part closure

### Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/ West Croydon route

**Sunday:** No service between Sydenham and Crystal Palace from 8.45pm until 11.15pm. This is owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local buses instead.

**Sunday:** No service between Surrey Quays and New Cross from 8.45pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use bus route 225 or services from New Cross Gate station instead.

**Sunday:** No service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell from 9.15pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use alternative London Overground trains between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Kingsland, or local buses between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Junction. Rail replacement buses will operate.

### Liverpool Street to Enfield Town/Cheshunt (via Seven Sisters)/ Chingford route

**Monday to Thursday:** No service between Hackney Downs and Chingford after 10.30pm for Network Rail track work. Use Enfield Town/Cheshunt trains between Liverpool Street and Hackney Downs. Rail replacement buses will operate.

### Romford to Upminster route

**Sunday:** No service between Romford and Upminster for Network Rail infrastructure work. Use local buses instead.

# Get out and about

THERE'S plenty to do in London this weekend. Here is MetroTravel's guide to some of the hottest happenings, with advice on how to get there.

## Vaisakhi festival

There'll be lots going on in Trafalgar Square tomorrow, with a free event taking place from 1pm in celebration of the Sikh festival of Vaisakhi. Visitors can watch an exciting stage programme, join in with sports activities and see one of the biggest exhibitions of Sikh art in the country. There will also be Indian tea and tasty street food to snack on.

**Getting there:** Charing Cross is the nearest Tube station [Bakerloo and Northern lines]. A large number of bus routes also serve Trafalgar Square.

## Concerts at The O2

British pop rock band The Vamps take over the O2 Arena tomorrow from 6.30pm. On Sunday, indigo at The O2 hosts Roop Kumar Rathod, Sunali Rathod and Jaswinder Singh in Bollywood and ghazal-inspired musical show Beyond Love.

**Getting there:** The nearest Tube station is North Greenwich (Jubilee line). Bus routes 108, 129, 132, 161, 188, 422, 472 and 486 all stop at North Greenwich station, and MBNA Thames Clippers from the London Eye and London Bridge stop at nearby North Greenwich Pier. The Emirates Air Line is a short walk from the arena.

## MFest

The UK's first festival of art and ideas dedicated to Muslim culture, MFest runs all weekend at the British Library and P21 Gallery. Ticket holders will be able to explore works by emerging and established writers, performers and artists, with events for families, children and adults.

**Getting there:** The British Library and P21 Gallery are a short walk from both Euston (Northern and Victoria lines) and Kings Cross St Pancras (Northern and Victoria lines only on Sunday – see travel information on the left for Circle, Hammersmith & City and Metropolitan lines). A number of bus services also stop nearby on the Euston Road.
