

Plan ahead for the weekend

Bakerloo line

Sunday: No service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone, owing to Network Rail track and infrastructure work. Rail replacement buses will run.

Circle line

All weekend: No service between Edgware Road and Aldgate via Victoria, owing to track replacement work. Use alternative Tube or local bus routes.

District line

All weekend: No service between South Kensington/Edgware Road and Acton Town/Richmond/Wimbledon/Kensington (Olympia), owing to track replacement and infrastructure work. Use alternative Tube or local bus routes. Rail replacement buses will run between Acton Town and Hammersmith/Shepherd's Bush, Hammersmith and Wimbledon, and between Kensington (Olympia) and Wimbledon.

Piccadilly line

All weekend: No service between Hyde Park Corner and Acton Town, including during the Friday and Saturday Night Tube service, owing to track replacement work. Use alternative Tube or local bus routes. Use TfL Rail services for Heathrow (these services do not run all night). A rail replacement coach service will run between Hyde Park Corner and Acton Town, apart from during the Night Tube service. Use Night Bus routes N9, N11 or N97.

DLR

All weekend: Eastbound trains will not stop at Blackwall station, owing to track work. Use Poplar or All Saints stations, or local bus route 15. Alternatively, travel on to the next station and travel back to Blackwall station, where the westbound platform will be open.

London Overground

All weekend: No service between Edmonton Green and Cheshunt, Romford and Upminster, and South Tottenham and Barking, owing to track work. Use alternative Tube and rail services, or local buses.

Sunday: No service between Euston and Watford Junction, owing to Network Rail track work. Use alternative Tube or local bus routes. Rail replacement buses will run between Watford Junction and Harrow & Wealdstone, and between Harrow & Wealdstone and Queen's Park.

TfL Rail

All weekend: No service between Liverpool Street and Shenfield, owing to track and Crossrail work. Use the Central line for travel between Liverpool Street and Newbury Park. Tickets will be accepted on local bus route 25. Rail replacement buses will also run.

Sunday: Trains will not stop at Acton Main Line and West Ealing stations. A reduced service will operate between Paddington and Hayes & Harlington, owing to train testing.



Getting out and about

VALENTINE'S DOG WALK

Head to Hampstead Heath with your dog on Sunday for this annual walk in aid of the charity All Dogs Matter. Don't forget to adorn yourself and pooch with costumes on the theme of 'loved up' for a chance to win a prize. You can register from 10am at the Garden Gate pub in Hampstead, and entry is £5 per dog.

Getting there: The nearest Tube station is Hampstead Heath (London Overground). Bus routes C11, 24, 46, 168 stop nearby.

MUSIC AND FILM VALENTINE FESTIVAL

There's lots going on in Ealing this weekend, with a jam-packed festival of screenings, workshops, gigs and recitals. This evening, don't miss out on the Ealing Youth Orchestra, including BBC Young Musician of the Year 2018 finalist Rob Burton, performing at 7.30pm at St Barnabas Church. Alternatively, head to the Ealing Classic Cinema Club to immerse yourself in Brief Encounter, the 1945 romantic drama about forbidden love.

Getting there: The nearest Tube station is Ealing Broadway (Central and District lines, TfL Rail). Several bus routes also serve the area.

LOVE LETTERS

The With Love exhibition at The National Archives features love letters which span 500 years. They explore themes of love, loss and longing.

You'll find the beautifully written will of Anne Lister bequeathing everything to her 'friend' Ann Walker, and a passionate love letter from Labour leader James Ramsay MacDonald to the glamorous aristocrat Lady Margaret Sackville.

The exhibition officially opens today and runs until 15 July.

Getting there: The nearest Tube station is Kew Gardens (District line and London Overground), which is around a 10-minute walk away. Bus routes 65, R68 and 391 also stop nearby.
