the Company possessed 6918 horses at that

corresponding period of 1861 was 6407, that  
during the week none were purchased - that  
the purchases in the corresponding week of  
1861 were 10 for £2.55, that 33 carcasses were  
sold for £61.10.0, and 5 living horses for £17.15.0,  
that 3290 gns. of oats at £1.1.7½, 1574 gns of  
beans at £2.3.3, 157¾ loads of hay and  
clover at £3.17.3½, and 137¾ loads of straw  
at £1.13.9¾ were purchased, that the prices in  
the corresponding week of 1861 were for oats  
proportionate to their weight £1.3.7, for hay
