
LEGO marker pens

Transport detectives

Until August 11

It's all action when youngsters embark on the trail to track down the lost property of London. They have up to an hour to find weird and wonderful items in a pop-up treasure trove at the museum.

Plus, there's story-time. Hear about a mysterious object that has turned up at the lost property office and nobody knows what it is or where it's come from.

London's transport detective is brought in to help.

Other activities

For young children, there's also the museum's All Aboard play zone where they can dress up and play conductor on a real bus, repair a mini Tube train with toy spanners, and work in the Lost Property Office.



Free Treat

Children can enjoy a treat with lunch to top off their visit to the museum. With a child's main meal and a cold drink for £6, they get a free ice cream or cupcake. Plus they can also add their own toppings, too, by visiting the frozen yoghurt station in the Lower Deck café.
