



Travel advice during today's Tube strike

Customers are advised that there will be a severely reduced service across the Underground network.

THE strike, which involves station staff union members, started at 6pm last night and will continue until the end of today.

TfL will try to run as many services as possible, but customers are advised that most Zone 1 stations are likely to be closed throughout the action.

Roads and other transport services, including buses, DLR and London Overground, are expected to be much busier than usual.

Tube

Piccadilly line services will run between Hammersmith and Heathrow Terminals 1, 2 and 3, but there will be no service to Terminals 4 or 5.

There is no service at all on the Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, and all other lines will be severely affected with limited services in outer London.

TfL is running a limited service on the District, Circle and Hammersmith and City lines, although trains will not stop at all stations.

National Rail services are not affected by the strike, but there will be no Underground services from key interchange stations such as Victoria, King's Cross, Waterloo, Paddington, Euston, Bank and London Bridge.

DLR

For customers travelling to Canary Wharf from central London, DLR services are running, but they will

be busier than usual. River services also link central London and Canary Wharf.

There may be changes to DLR services towards Bank, with trains terminating at Shadwell or Tower Gateway instead.

Buses, roads and rail

These services are expected to be much busier than usual, particularly those bus routes serving major interchange stations.

More than 150 extra buses are being deployed to enhance existing routes.

TfL Travel Ambassadors will be at certain sites across London to help customers get around.

River

There will be an enhanced river service running throughout the day. Oyster pay as you go and contactless are accepted on MBNA Thames Clippers services. Embankment pier is currently closed for emergency work, so customers should use Westminster pier instead, which is an eight-minute walk away.

Santander Cycles

Temporary Santander Cycle Hire hubs with additional bikes will be available at Soho Square and Newgate Street (St. Paul's).

TfL will aim to fill existing hubs at Waterloo station and Belgrave Street (King's Cross St. Pancras) to capacity,

and cycle hire staff will be at each hub to offer help and assistance.

The right ticket

CUSTOMERS should note that buses do not accept cash, but you can pay as you go using a contactless payment or Oyster card, or with a One Day Bus & Tram Pass.

Pay as you go credit can be topped up at around 4,000 Oyster Ticket Stops across the capital, which are mostly newsagents, or at visitor centres.

Printed Tube tickets will be accepted on bus and tram services on reasonable alternative routes and Travelcards will be accepted within the zones purchased as usual.

National Rail tickets valid for cross-London travel will be accepted on buses on reasonable alternative routes.
