THE Northern line ticket hall was transformed to look like a scene from the TV series, complete with The Iron Throne, where fans could have their picture taken. Frosty imagery was projected on digital screens and escalator panels, and a live band busked the famous theme song.

TfL is consulting on the following proposals:

### Mayor's Transport Strategy Closes October 2

Mayor Sadiq Khan wants to create a better city for all Londoners, and transport is at the heart of his vision. The strategy sets out plans to transform the capital's streets, improve public transport and create opportunities for new homes and jobs.

### Lambeth Bridge Closes August 20

At Lambeth Bridge north and south, TfL proposes to transform the road layout to create a safer environment for cycling and walking.

### Waterloo Closes August 20

There are plans to transform Waterloo roundabout and Waterloo Road to create a larger, greener and more accessible public space for communities, pedestrians, bus passengers and cyclists.

### Nine Elms Closes August 20

TfL wants to improve safety and facilities for cyclists and pedestrians in Nine Elms Lane and Battersea Park Road.

### Camden Town Closes August 18

TfL wants to hear your views on its plans to improve capacity at Camden Town station and provide step-free access from the street to trains.

### Croydon Closes September 18

Have your say on proposals to change the road layout in the Fiveways Croydon area. The aim is to help reduce traffic congestion, improve journey times and make the area safer, more accessible and pleasant for cyclists and pedestrians.
