654 The Secretary presented a Cash Statement to date of the finances of the Company, which was read to the Meeting.

Resolved That Share Certificates in respect of Transfers as per list bearing to-day's date (October 24th) and submitted to this Meeting, be sealed.

The Deputy Chairman reported regarding the settlement which he had made with the British Electrical Engineering Co., in respect of the cancellation of the order given to the British Company on behalf of the Metropolitan District Railway Co., for forty (40) steel trail cars at £580. per car, and it was

Resolved That a payment be made by this Company on behalf of the Metropolitan District Railway Co., of Four Thousand pounds (£4,000.) in full settlement of all claims of every kind which the British Company have or may have against the Underground Electric Railways Company of London Ltd., the late Chairman, C. J. Jenkes or his Estate, or the Metropolitan District Railway Company consequent on the said order, or the cancellation thereof, and it was further

668. **Resolved** That this amount be charged to the Metropolitan District Railway Company's electricification account.

669. The Chairman reported in regard to the loans from the four Banks, amounting to £100,000.- which loans will become due on November 2nd next that the Union of London & Smith's Bank, Lt'd., the London & Westminster Bank Lt'd., and the London & County Banking Co. Ltd., have all agreed to extend the loans for a further period of six months from November 2nd next to May 2nd 1907 on the same terms as they are now carrying the present loans.

The Chairman further reported that Messrs.

Glyn Mills Currie & Co. required payment of their loan of £250,000. = on November 2nd and that he had therefore arranged with the Union of London & Smith's Bank Ltd. to make a further loan of £125,000. = from November 2nd for six months, and that he had also arranged with Messrs. Speyer Brothers to loan this Company £125,000. = for the same period on the same terms as the others. Glyn, Mills, Currie & Co., are now carrying their loan, namely Bank of England rate, with a minimum of 4%.

Resolved that the actions of the Chairman be and is hereby approved and confirmed.

It was reported that the engagement of Mr. James R. Chapman as chief Engineer of the Company will terminate on 1st March 1907, and it was

Resolved that Mr. Chapman be retained as chief Engineer of the Company for a further period of twelve months from 1st March 1907 at his present salary of £5,000. = per annum.
