

Plan ahead for the weekend

FOR A SMOOTH JOURNEY THIS WEEKEND, CHECK AHEAD TO SEE IF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING IMPROVEMENT WORKS AFFECT YOU.

Central line

Part closure

All weekend: Central line trains, including Night Tube services, will not stop at Bank station between 5am on Saturday and 5am on Sunday. Use nearby St Paul's station instead.

District line

Part closure

Sunday: No service between Richmond and Turnham Green for Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

DLR

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Canning Town and Beckton, owing to track and maintenance work. Replacement buses will run.

DLR services will run the following amended routes: Bank – Lewisham; Bank – Woolwich Arsenal; Stratford – Canary Wharf; Stratford International – Woolwich Arsenal and Tower Gateway – Canning Town.

London Overground

Part closure

RICHMOND/CLAPHAM JUNCTION TO STRATFORD ROUTE

Sunday: No service between Richmond and Willesden Junction, owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

HIGHBURY & ISLINGTON TO NEW CROSS/CLAPHAM JUNCTION/CRYSTAL PALACE/WEST CROYDON ROUTE

Sunday: No service between Sydenham and Crystal Palace from 8.45pm until 11.15pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local buses instead.

No service between Surrey Quays and New Cross after 8.45pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local bus route 225 or nearby New Cross Gate for connecting trains via Surrey Quays.

No service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell after 9.15pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local buses between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Junction, or alternative London Overground trains between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Kingsland. Replacement buses will run between Dalston Kingsland and Shadwell.

LIVERPOOL STREET TO ENFIELD TOWN/CHESHUNT (VIA SEVEN SISTERS)/CHINGFORD ROUTE

Sunday: No service between Hackney Downs and Chingford until 8am, owing to Network Rail track work. Use London Underground services or local buses instead.

Lift work at Canning Town

FROM Tuesday until mid-November, there will be no step-free access between the ticket hall and bus station at Canning Town station, owing to lift refurbishment works.

Customers requiring step-free access to/from the DLR and Jubilee line can use bus route 69, which is a 24-hour service, between Canning Town and Stratford.

Passengers will still be able to interchange between lines at Canning Town.

LONDON TO BRIGHTON BIKE RIDE

If you've got a sporty dad, why not join him in cheering on participants in The British Heart Foundation's London to Brighton Bike Ride? The popular annual fund-raising event takes place on Sunday, with cyclists taking on an impressive 54 miles. Head to Clapham Common between 5.30am and 10am to catch the start, or watch participants passing through Tooting, Mitcham and Carshalton on the London leg.

Getting there: The nearest Tube to the start is Clapham Common (Northern line). A number of buses stop near the route, but check before you travel as there will be diversions in place.

WEST END LIVE 2018

Treat dad to a West End show... well, sort of. Now in its 14th year, this free event in Trafalgar Square celebrates the capital's wide range of musical theatre productions. Running from 11am on Saturday and midday on Sunday, the programme includes performances from top West End productions such as Mamma Mia!, Les Miserables, Wicked and Aladdin. No tickets are needed – just turn up and enjoy the fun.

Getting there: Charing Cross (Bakerloo and Northern lines), Embankment (Bakerloo, Circle, District and Northern lines) and Leicester Square (Northern and Piccadilly lines) are all within a five to ten-minute walk of Trafalgar Square.

CHEESE STREET SE3

Let your foodie father know you appreciate him (cheesy jokes and all) with a trip to this free festival at Blackheath Farmers Market, on Sunday. There will be tastings, beer and wine, unusual cheeses to buy and even a chance to see butter being made.

Getting there: The market is held in the car park at Blackheath station (National Rail). Bus routes 54, 108 and 202 stop nearby.

More town for your pounds

GETTING to the good stuff needn't break the bank. Buses across London cost just £1.50 for unlimited journeys within an hour and are capped at just £4.50 a day. On the Tube, DLR and London Overground, adult off-peak

'pay as you go' fares start from £1.50 for Zones 2-6 and into central London (Zone 1) from £2.40.

There is also a range of concessions available for children and those over 60.
