Night Tube
Service

week to go until the Northern line joins the Night Tube network

There are no planned works on the Central, District, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement work.

Bakerloo line

Part closure

Sunday: no service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone owing to Network Rail track improvement work. There will also be no London Overground service between Queen's Park and Watford Junction. Replacement buses will call at: Queen's Park – Kensal Green – Willesden Junction – North Acton (for the Central line) – Harlesden – Stonebridge Park – Wembley Central – North Wembley – Preston Road (for the Metropolitan line and South Kenton station) – Kenton – Harrow & Wealdstone.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Hammersmith and Edgware Road while new signalling is tested and track replaced at Latimer Road. Replacement buses will call at: Hammersmith – Goldhawk Road (for Shepherd's Bush Market) – Shepherd's Bush (for the Central line) – Latimer Road – Ladbroke Grove – Westbourne Park – Royal Oak – Paddington – Edgware Road – Baker Street. Customers for Wood Lane should use nearby White City station on the Central line.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Hammersmith and Edgware Road while new signalling is tested and track replaced at Latimer Road. See the Circle line entry for replacement bus information.

DLR

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Stratford International and Canning Town owing to track work. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

Update on tram services in Croydon

AT around 6.15am on Wednesday, a tram derailed near the Sandilands tram stop in Croydon. There is currently no service between East Croydon and Addington Village/Harrington Road/Elmers End. A limited service is running between: Wimbledon and East Croydon; Beckenham Junction and Harrington Road; and New Addington and Addington Village. The A232 Addiscombe Road is closed between Park Hill

Road and Shirley Road and some buses have been diverted. A special bus service is running between Addington Village and East Croydon, and extra buses are running on routes 130, 289, 367 and 466. Tram tickets are being accepted on alternative TfL and National Rail services.

London Overground

Part closure

Richmond/Clapham Junction to Stratford route

Sunday: no service between Richmond and Willesden Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Use District line services between Richmond and Gunnersbury. Replacement buses will call at: Gunnersbury – South Acton – Acton Central – Willesden Junction.

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

Sunday: no service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will start at London Bridge, calling at: New Cross Gate – Brockley – Honor Oak Park – Forest Hill – Sydenham – Crystal Palace – Anerley (for Penge West) – Norwood Junction – Selhurst – West Croydon.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Until February: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018. Replacement bus services will run:

Service J: Gospel Oak (bus stops in Highgate Road) – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill (bus stops in Hornsey Road) – Finsbury Park (Tube) – Harringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham).

Service T: Walthamstow Central – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road (bus stops at Harrow Green) – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham (Tube) – Barking.

At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road. Use Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

Watford Junction to Euston route

Sunday: no service between Watford Junction and Euston owing to Network Rail signalling and track work. Replacement buses will run:

Service H: Watford Junction – Watford High Street – Bushey – Carpenders Park – Hatch End – Headstone Lane – Harrow & Wealdstone.

Service A: Harrow & Wealdstone – Kenton – Preston Road (for South Kenton) – North Wembley – Wembley Central – Stonebridge Park – Harlesden – North Acton (Tube) – Willesden Junction – Kensal Green – Queen's Park.

Service B: Wembley Central – Stonebridge Park – Harlesden – Willesden Junction – North Acton (Tube) – Kensal Green – Queen's Park.

Use local bus or Tube services between Queen's Park and Euston via all reasonable routes (entrance/exit at Queen's Park, Kilburn Park, Euston Square and Euston stations only).

Travel advice for events in the city this weekend

THE annual Lord Mayor's Show will be held tomorrow in the City from 7am to 5pm, with fireworks at 5.15pm.

On Sunday, the National Service of Remembrance will take place at The Cenotaph between 10am and 2pm, together with the Remembrance Day Parade.

Buses in central London will be on diversion or stop short of their destination. Some of the service changes will be in place from today. Roads in the City, and Blackfriars and Waterloo Bridges, will be closed.

Tube and rail will be the best way to get around central London, although many Tube stations may be busier than usual, including Bank, St. James's Park and Embankment.

Members of the London Transport Old

Comrades Association will take part in the annual Remembrance Sunday parade to the Cenotaph on Sunday in honour of the 4,500 transport workers who died in the two World Wars and other conflicts.

London transport has been connected to Remembrance Sunday since 1920 when bus staff were given the right to march alongside the armed forces by King George V. This is in recognition of the services of those who drove buses to the front line in France and Belgium from 1914-1918.
