IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

There are no planned works on the Central, Circle, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, the Docklands Light Railway or TfL Rail. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Bakerloo line

Part closure

Saturday: no service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone owing to Network Rail improvement work. There will also be no London Overground service between Queen's Park and Wembley Central. Replacement buses will call at: Queen's Park - Kensal Green - Willesden Junction - North Acton (for the Central line) - Harlesden - Stonebridge Park - Wembley Central.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Turnham Green and Ealing Broadway while the track layout at Ealing Common is replaced and renewed. Replacement buses will call at: Turnham Green - Chiswick High Road (for Chiswick Park) - Gunnersbury (for London Overground and District line services) - Acton Town - Ealing Common - Ealing Broadway.

Piccadilly line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Acton Town and Uxbridge while the track layout at Ealing Common is replaced and renewed. Use the Metropolitan line between Rayners Lane and Uxbridge. Replacement buses will call at: Acton Town - Ealing Common - North Ealing - Hanger Lane (for the Central line and Park Royal station) - Alperton - Sudbury Town - Sudbury Hill - South Harrow - Rayners Lane. Trains will also call at Turnham Green all weekend.

London Overground

Part closure

Saturday: no service between Wembley Central and Queen's Park owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

All weekend: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking while preparatory works for electrification are completed. Replacement buses will run.

Sunday: no service between Clapham Junction and Willesden Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

London Trams

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Wimbledon and Dundonald Road owing to platform construction work that will help to increase capacity. Local buses connect Wimbledon with London Trams at: Merton Park - Wimbledon (163 and 164); Morden Road - Wimbledon (93); and Phipps Bridge - Wimbledon (200). Tram tickets are accepted on these buses.

Changes at Farringdon station

FROM Monday, there will be changes at Farringdon while work is carried out to prepare the station for Crossrail services. During this time, one of the staircases to the northbound platform 4 will be closed. Thameslink customers are advised to use alternative stairs and allow extra time for boarding or exiting trains at the station. When the work is complete in 2018, customers will benefit from new escalators and stairs, to both Thameslink and Crossrail platforms.



48-hour DLR strike next week


DOCKLANDS Light Railway (DLR) workers are to stage a 48-hour strike next week, from 4am Tuesday until 4am Thursday. The dispute, between RMT and KeolisAmey Docklands, is over a breakdown in industrial relations. If the strike goes ahead it is unlikely that any DLR services will operate.

Travel advice for the Rugby World Cup final

THOUSANDS of people will descend on the capital today and tomorrow to enjoy the climax of the Rugby World Cup.

The Bronze Final kick-off will be at 8pm this evening at the Stadium, Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park, and is expected to finish at around 9.40pm or later. The Jubilee line is expected to be extremely busy eastbound before and after the match. If you're not a spectator, to beat the crowds consider re-timing your journey, find alternative routes or travel outside of the busiest times listed below on the following routes:



From around 9.40pm to midnight (westbound):

- Stratford International to Canning Town (DLR)
- Stratford International to King's Cross St. Pancras (Southeastern high speed service)
- Stratford to Canary Wharf (DLR)
- Stratford to central London/Bond Street (Central and Jubilee lines)
- Stratford to Highbury & Islington (London Overground)
- Stratford to Liverpool Street (Abellio Greater Anglia and TfL Rail)

Tube/rail stations and lines serving the Stadium are also expected to be much busier than usual up to three hours before and two hours after the match. Drivers should be aware that certain roads in and around Stratford will be closed two hours before the match and will reopen as soon as it is safe to do so, which is expected to be around 10.30pm.

From around 5pm to 7.30pm (eastbound):

- Canning Town to Stratford (DLR)
- Canary Wharf to Stratford (DLR)
- Central London/Bond Street to Stratford (Central and Jubilee lines)
- Highbury & Islington to Stratford (London Overground)
- King's Cross St. Pancras to Stratford International (Southeastern high speed service)
- Liverpool Street to Stratford (Abellio Greater Anglia and TfL Rail)

Tomorrow's final

The final kicks off at 4pm tomorrow at Twickenham. Public transport and roads around the venue will be much busier a few hours before and after the match. From 1pm, some roads will be closed, including the A316 Chertsey Road between London Road and Hospital Bridge Road. The eastbound entry to the A316 from Feltham Hill Road/Snakey Lane will also be closed. They will reopen as soon as it's safe. This is expected to be two hours after the event, but congestion will take up to three hours to disperse.
