Book tickets now for Aldwych winter tours

IF you'd like the opportunity to visit one of London's most filmed stations, you need to act fast as tickets sell out quickly.

A new season of the ever-popular tours of Aldwych station has just been announced for January and February.

Aldwych is regarded as one of London's mysterious places, holding secrets and memories of the city's forgotten life and work underground. It opened to the public in 1907 as Strand, was never heavily used as originally intended, and closed nearly a century later in 1994.

The station has had a varied history; it provided shelter to Londoners during the Blitz and has been used for film and TV shoots including *Sherlock*, *Mr Selfridge* and *Atonement*.

The tours start on January 22 and will run Thursday to Sunday until February 15. They will involve groups of up to 40 people being escorted by museum volunteers



into the ticket hall and then down 160 steps to the platforms and inter-connecting walkways - including some that have very rarely been seen by the public.

Although there is nothing

unsuitable about the content of the tour, children under 16 are not allowed to attend.

A proposal to transform Wandsworth town centre by removing the gyratory.

Extension of the Bakerloo line Closes December 7 2014

Extension of the Bakerloo line south from Elephant & Castle station towards Lewisham, Bromley and Hayes.

Silvertown Tunnel Closes December 19 2014

Proposal for a new tunnel under the Thames at Silvertown.
