

An all-night Jubilee

Enjoy 24-hour weekend travel from Stanmore to Stratford from tomorrow as the Night Tube arrives on the Jubilee line.

THE new service allows passengers to travel around the clock on the Jubilee line on Fridays and Saturdays, which runs through stations such as Westminster, Waterloo, Canary Wharf and North Greenwich.

It means that fans heading to Wembley this weekend for England's game against Malta will be able to stay to the final whistle and enjoy the post-match atmosphere without having to rush for the last train.

Also, concert-goers at the Jean-Michel Jarre gig at the O2 tomorrow will be able to stay until the final strobe light has gone out.

The launch follows the success of the Night Tube service on the Central and Victoria lines, which introduced 24-hour trains in August. On the first weekend, more than 100,000 passenger journeys were made on the two lines, with Oxford Circus seeing 6,500 passengers tapping in on the opening night.

Tube demand has soared over recent years, with passenger numbers on Friday and Saturday nights up by around 70 per cent since 2000, while demand for travel on night buses has risen by over 170 per cent in the same period.



Don't forget, Night Tube journeys are classed as off-peak. Day Travelcards cover journeys made until 4.29am the next day. If you touch in before 4.30am then your travel will fall within the previous day's cap. Paper tickets are still valid but you'll need a member of staff to let you out via the ticket barriers.



Buses to support the Night Tube

TWO new bus routes will launch tonight to help Jubilee line passengers complete their onward journey in north west London.

Route 114 will travel between Mill Hill and Ruislip Station, via Queensbury, Harrow and South Harrow.

The 183 will run between Golders Green and Pinner, calling at Kingsbury and Harrow. Both services

will run every half hour through the night on Fridays and Saturdays.

Passengers using the south eastern end of the Jubilee line will be able take advantage of TfL's extensive network of night buses already serving the area.


