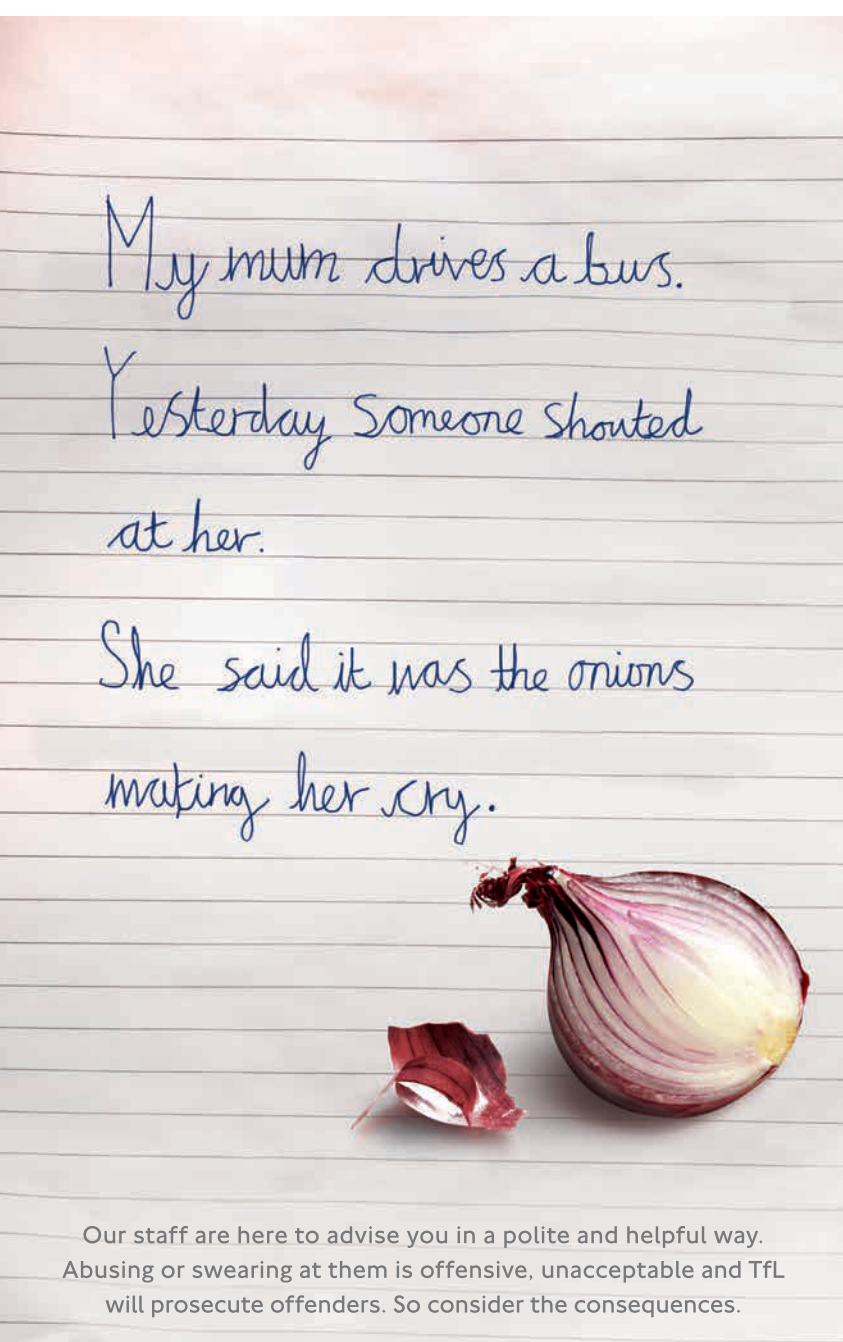




Heading to Charing Cross?

There will also be the chance to get creative in the 'Build a boat that floats' session, using recycled objects.
