

Rainbows in Brixton

Art on the Underground has teamed up with Studio Voltaire and This is Clapham to celebrate the work of late Australian artist and activist, David McDiarmid.

CALLED 'Rainbow Aphorisms', it is the first major presentation of the artist's work in the UK.

Designed between 1993-1995, the images feature short bold statements set on rainbow backgrounds that reference McDiarmid's experience of the AIDS crisis.

The vibrant and colourful artworks (pictured right) will be displayed above the entrance to Brixton Underground and at stations across London.

MAYOR Sadiq Khan and London assembly members will be questioned about their plans and priorities for the city on Thursday November 2.


Londoners will have the chance to raise issues that matter to them such as transport, safety, air quality, the environment, housing and the capital's economy.

Abbey Wood opens its doors

THE striking new station building and concourse, delivered by Network Rail as part of the Crossrail project, has opened to Southeastern passengers.

Work will continue to complete the station's facilities,

including new lifts serving the Elizabeth line.

From December 2018, passengers will be able to take the Elizabeth line from Abbey Wood and travel right through the centre of London to Paddington.
