

## Full steam ahead for vintage trains



**LONDON** Transport Museum will celebrate 125 years of the Chesham branch of the Metropolitan line with steam train journeys this weekend.

The train will be hauled by Metropolitan Locomotive No.1, which was restored last year to its former 1898 glory and L150 Steam Locomotive. Passengers can travel in the Chesham Set coaches, built in 1898 and 1900, and the Metropolitan Jubilee carriage 353. The 1896 Metropolitan Milk Van and

Sarah Siddons electric locomotive will also make up the train.

There will be four runs on each day:

- The first between Wembley Park and Rickmansworth
- Two from Rickmansworth to Chesham and return to Rickmansworth
- The last run will go from Rickmansworth to Chesham and return to Harrow-on-the-Hill

Look out for the Museum's pop-up shop at Rickmansworth station, selling gifts and mementoes including exclusive Metropolitan line commemorative products.

### River crossings – have your say !

THERE is still time to share your views on a number of proposed new river crossings in east London. The current consultation ends on September 12 and the following new proposals are being considered:

- A ferry service or a bridge at Gallions Reach between Beckton and Thamesmead
- A bridge at Belvedere between Rainham and Belvedere
- A ferry at Woolwich

There are also two remaining drop-in sessions where people can find out more:

- Broadway shopping centre, Bexleyheath on Saturday August 30, 9am - 2pm

- Vicarage Fields shopping centre, Saturday September 6, 10am - 5.30pm

The new river crossings will bring huge benefits for people and businesses on both sides of the Thames, providing new road connections between east and southeast London, cutting journey times and supporting local growth. They could be in place by 2025.

This consultation is happening as TfL's proposals for a new road tunnel in Silvertown, which could be complete by 2021, continue to move forward.
