Update: Lifts at Vauxhall station

THERE is currently no lift service from Vauxhall Tube station to the bus station. This is while lift replacement work takes place.

Customers who are unable to use the stairs are advised to take bus 360 from stop B to Pimlico station, which has ramp and escalator access. For Stockwell, take bus 2 or 88 from stop D or bus 196 from stop G. For Brixton, take bus 2 from stop D or bus 196 from stop G.

A306 Roehampton Lane Until March 13, 6am

Lane restrictions on all approaches to the A3 Kingston Road junction for resurfacing works.

A316 Chiswick Bridge Weekend night closures, February 21 to March 9, 1am to 4am

The bridge will be closed overnight on three weekends for road works.

Westminster area February 22, 7am to 8pm

Widespread road closures in China Town and surrounding area for Chinese New Year celebrations. Buses will be diverted. Expect delays.

A3 Arthur Street, EC4 February 23, 8am to July 3, 6pm

Road closed between Martin Lane and King William Street for utility works. Diversions will be in place.

Green Lanes, N8/N15 February 23, 5pm to 7pm

A march will take place from Ducketts Common to Haringey Civic Centre. Expect slow moving traffic.
