IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Circle, District, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly or Waterloo & City lines, Docklands Light Railway or TfL Rail. However, the Victoria line will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Victoria line

Part closure

From tomorrow until August 30: no service between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central, and fewer trains will run on the rest of the line. See right for details.

London Overground

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Hackney Wick and Stratford owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run – see tfl.gov.uk for details.

Sunday: no service between Richmond and Camden Road until 11am owing to Network Rail track work. Use local buses and/or Tube services via all reasonable routes (tickets will only be accepted for entrance/exit at Gunnersbury and Willesden Junction).

Sunday: no service between Shepherd's Bush and Willesden Junction until 11am owing to Network Rail track work. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

London Trams


Part closure

Until October: no service between Wimbledon and Dundonald Road owing to platform construction work that will help to increase capacity. Trams start and terminate at Dundonald Road. Local buses connect Wimbledon with London Trams at: Merton Park – Wimbledon (163 and 164); Morden Road – Wimbledon (93); and Phipps Bridge – Wimbledon (200). Tram tickets will be accepted on these buses.

All weekend: no service between Reeves Corner and East Croydon owing to town centre improvement work. Trams from Beckenham Junction, Elmers End and New Addington will terminate at East Croydon. Trams from Dundonald Road will terminate at Reeves Corner. Line 4 will not run. Bus 410 links East Croydon and Reeves Corner.

Last weekend's improvements to the Tube

LAST weekend, as part of work to improve the Circle, District and Hammersmith & City lines, 330metres of track were replaced in the Wood Lane area and 150metres between Edgware Road and Paddington. Points and ballast was also renewed at Hammersmith depot and new sleepers installed at Hammersmith station.



Victoria line service changes

FROM tomorrow until August 30, there will be no Victoria line service between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central, and fewer trains will run on the rest of the line.

This is owing to major work to enable a more frequent service to operate from next year – up to 36 trains an hour.

During this time, the rest of the Victoria line, the Central line between Bond Street and Leyton, and London Overground services in north east London are expected to be busier than normal, especially during peak hours.

The northbound Victoria line platform at Victoria station will be much busier than usual, especially between 8.30am and 9.30am, with queuing likely. It may be easier to use Circle or District line services, or local buses.

Alternative travel options Replacement buses:

Service A: Walthamstow Central – Blackhorse Road – Tottenham Hale – Seven Sisters

Service B: Walthamstow Central – St James Street – Stratford International – Stratford City bus station for Stratford station (Monday to Friday only)

Temporary local bus route 558: Chingford Mount – Chingford Mount Road – South Chingford – Chingford Road – Walthamstow Crooked Billet – Billet Road – Higham Hill – Blackhorse Lane – Blackhorse Road station – Tottenham Hale – Seven Sisters station (Monday to Friday only, normal fares apply)

Tube tickets will also be accepted on:

- Abellio Greater Anglia: Liverpool Street – Tottenham Hale, Liverpool Street –

Stratford, and Stratford – Tottenham Hale

- Great Northern: Finsbury Park – Moorgate, via Drayton Park, Highbury & Islington, Essex Road, Old Street
- Southeastern: Brixton – Victoria
- South West Trains: Vauxhall – Waterloo

London Overground services are expected to be full on departure from Walthamstow Central. As a result, before 9.30am on weekdays, trains will not stop at Clapton, and St James Street will be exit-only, as passengers will be unable to board at those stations.

Customers are advised to use replacement or local bus services.

Trains will leave Chingford, Highams Park and Wood Street two minutes earlier than timetabled and Enfield Town and Bush Hill Park one minute earlier, to allow passengers more time to board further down the line. In addition, Abellio Greater Anglia services will not call at Edmonton Green in the morning peak because these trains are expected to be already full.

Improvements

Currently, only 24 trains an hour can run beyond Seven Sisters owing to the layout of the points at Walthamstow Central crossover. The crossover is now being rebuilt but the nature and scale of the work means it is not possible to do it during the limited engineering hours available at nights and weekends.
