TRAVEL YOUR WAY AROUND THE MONOPOLY BOARD

KNOWINGLY or unknowingly, most Londoners have probably passed through many of the locations on the world's most famous board game. But what if you want to work your way around the whole lot in one day? Check out the directions below. To avoid having to double back on yourself several times, these aren't in perfect running order, but will get you all the way to Mayfair.

PASS GO!

Don't collect £200 on the Old Kent Road. Take the 21, 53, 172 or 453 bus to New Cross Gate, then catch the London Overground to Whitechapel.

Whitechapel Road is outside the station. From here, take the Hammersmith & City line to King's Cross St Pancras station. On the way, pop out at Liverpool Street to avoid having to return later.

At King's Cross St Pancras, catch the city branch of the Northern line to the Angel Islington. Hop on the 73 bus from the top of Pentonville Road. This will take you back past King's Cross and the British Library on Euston Road.

Disembark at Euston station. Take the Northern line to Charing Cross and walk across Trafalgar Square to Pall Mall.

Off Pall Mall, on Cockspur Street, catch the 88 bus to take you to Whitehall (bus stop N). Walk along Great Scotland Yard or Whitehall Place to Northumberland Avenue.

From Northumberland Avenue, walk to Embankment Tube station.

It's a ten-minute journey on the Bakerloo line to Marylebone station.

Get back on the Bakerloo line to Piccadilly Circus and then take the Piccadilly line to Covent Garden station. This is just a short walk from Bow Street. From here, walk to Holborn and catch the Central line to Oxford Circus. Take the Argyll Street exit and walk down to Great Malborough Street (on the board it is named Malborough Street).

TAKE A CHANCE

Walk from here to Regent Street and catch any bus heading south to Piccadilly. Get off at bus stop F and cross the road to reach Vine Street – the shortest street on the board. Vine Street is within Mayfair, but we'll return this way later.

Walk to Piccadilly Circus and catch the number 6 bus from stop B. This will take you through Trafalgar Square to the Strand. Disembark at Charing Cross and swap for the 11 or 15, which will take you on to Fleet Street – 12 minutes away.

If you took the number 15, stay on to ride to Great Tower Street (bus stop TU). From here, it's a five-minute walk up Mark Lane to Fenchurch Street station.

Walk to Tower Hill and catch the District/Circle line to Embankment. Transfer to the Northern line for Leicester Square. Walk to Coventry Street, which connects Leicester Square with Piccadilly.

Catch the Bakerloo line at Piccadilly Circus Tube station back to Oxford Circus and Oxford Street. From here, you can either walk west to Bond Street Tube (approximately ten minutes), or hop on the 7, 98 or 159 bus for a couple of stops.

At Bond Street, catch the Central line to Marble Arch station. Park Lane runs south from Marble Arch.

Finally, Mayfair is not a street but is the entire area east of Park Lane. Explore at your leisure...and dream of buying a house or hotel!

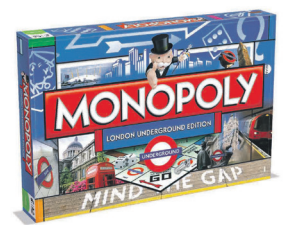
