



On the move!

Active youngsters are in for a treat at the London Transport Museum this half-term.

A SERIES of dance and movement workshops are being held at the Covent Garden venue where children can make noises and move around to the 'sounds of the city'.

They will join the museum's resident dancer on an imaginative adventure across London, recreating some of the noises city dwellers might hear over the course of the day. It will include the chirping of birds in the morning, the roar of traffic, the pitter-patter of footsteps as a passenger runs for the bus and the melody of a busker in a Tube station.

The workshops are designed for children aged three to 12 and a variety of props are used to help them make the different city sounds.

The sessions are inspired by the

museum's latest exhibition, The Prize for Illustration 2017: Sounds of the City and after the workshop the youngsters can try to find the same sounds among the 100 illustrations on show in the exhibition.

Tickets

The museum will open at 9.30am during the May half term, from Saturday May 27 to Sunday June 4, including Bank Holiday Monday (May 29).

Tickets are £17.50 (adults) and £15 (concessions) on the door, and allow unlimited daytime entry to all the museum galleries and temporary exhibitions for a whole year.

Children aged 17 and under go free (under 12s must be accompanied by an adult).

They offer something for all ages and abilities, with levels ranging from challenging treks to short strolls suitable for families.

Here are some of MetroTravel's favourites - book quickly as places are running out fast.

The Thames - transformation from docks to designer development

Saturday May 20, 1.30pm

This route explores the area around the Tower of London to the east of the city. From the Jubilee Walkway to St Katherine Dock then along the river towards Wapping, where you will learn about world trade, pirates, riverside pubs, and the transformation of an area from slums to film star houses.

Goodnight Mister Tom

Saturday May 20, 2pm

Inspired by the much-loved children's book 'Goodnight Mister Tom' by Michelle Magorian, this family-friendly walk explores the City of London and reveals what life was like for those who lived in London during the Blitz.



St Paul's and the secret corners of the city - St Paul's circular walk

Saturday May 20, 11.30am and 3pm

Discover unknown tranquil gardens, ruined churches, hidden courtyards, and modern architecture on this circular walk around St Paul's. See remnants of London's medieval past, and hear stories about the rich and famous including Oliver Cromwell, Christopher Wren and Pink Floyd.
