## Advice for Jubilee and District line passengers

PLANNED strike action by the ASLEF and RMT unions on Wednesday could impact customers on the Jubilee and District lines.

If it goes ahead, the strike will mean there will be no service on the Jubilee line all day and delays on parts of the District line. All other TfL services will run as normal.

Customers are advised to use alternative routes where possible and allow more time than usual to complete their journeys.

The impact on District line customers in central London is expected to be minimal, owing to a normal service on the Circle line. Services between Gloucester Road and Tower Hill will be regular, but

there will be more time between trains to all western branches of the District line via Earl's Court, and east of Tower Hill.

There will also be no District line services to Kensington (Olympia), although London Overground and Southern services will call at the station as usual.

TfL Travel Ambassadors will be at key locations to provide travel information and advice to customers on both lines.
