There are no planned works on any Tube lines, TfL Rail, DLR or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

London Overground

Part closure

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

Sunday: no service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will call at: Canada Water – Surrey Quays – Queens Road Peckham – Peckham Rye – Denmark Hill – Clapham High Street – Wandsworth Road – Clapham Junction.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

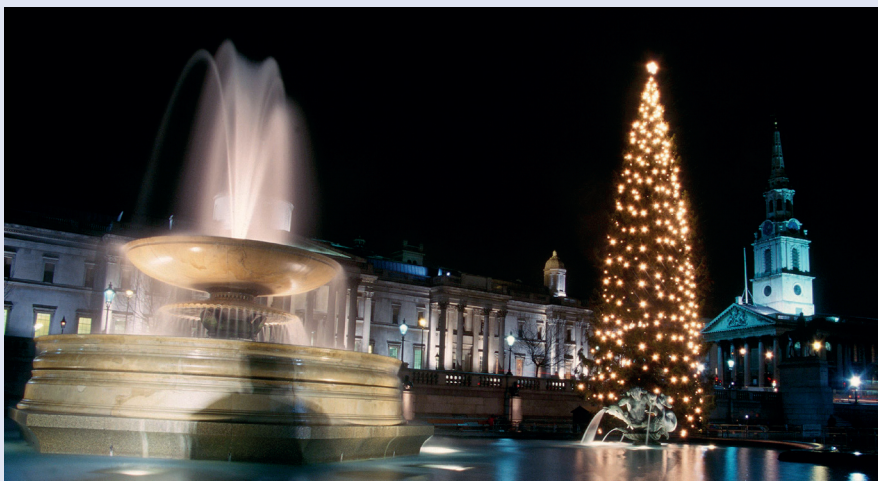
Until February: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018. Replacement buses will run:

Service J: Gospel Oak [bus stops are in Highgate Road] – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill [bus stops are in Hornsey Road] – Finsbury Park (Tube) – Harringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters [for South Tottenham].

Service T: Walthamstow Central – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road [bus stops at Harrow Green] – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham (Tube) – Barking.

At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road. Use Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

Events that may affect your travel on Sunday



PEOPLE will gather at St Martin-in-the-Fields church steps on Sunday at 5.20pm for a torch-lit procession to Trafalgar Square where the Christmas story will be told in words and music. There won't be any road closures, however nearby stations may be busier than usual.

The Belgravia Christmas Market also takes place on Sunday. Elizabeth Street will be closed to all traffic including buses, between Chester Row and Ebury Street between 7am and 7pm.

Next week

From Monday until December 23 (except December 10 and 17), various groups will perform Christmas carols in Trafalgar Square to raise funds for charity. There will be no road closures, however nearby stations may be busier than usual.

New Year's Eve fireworks in London

THE second and final batch of tickets for the New Year's Eve fireworks display in the capital go on sale at midday today. Tickets are £10, up to four can be bought at a time and there's a choice of five viewing areas. The event kicks off

at 7.30pm at the London Eye. Central London will be very busy so plan ahead and use public transport to get around.

Issues on the Piccadilly line

CHANGES in the weather and heavy leaf fall are affecting some Tube services. When track becomes slippery it can cause damage to the wheels of trains, requiring them to be taken out of service to be fixed.

The Piccadilly line trains are most affected as they are among the oldest on the network. Engineers are working around the clock to make the necessary repairs so trains can be returned to service as quickly as possible. TfL is sorry for the disruption this issue is causing.

In the meantime, a service is running to all destinations on the line and the Acton Town to Rayners Lane branch is being supplemented with extra bus services. Tickets are also being accepted on all buses and National Rail services.
