Keep on running

The Virgin Money London Marathon returns to the capital on Sunday. Runners, spectators, motorists and passengers are being reminded to plan their journeys.

London Underground

Tube services in central areas will run as normal. The following stations will be busier than usual:

- Blackfriars (Circle and District lines and Thameslink trains)
- Canada Water (Jubilee line and London Overground)
- Canary Wharf (Jubilee line and DLR)
- Charing Cross (Bakerloo and Northern lines, and Southeastern trains)
- Embankment (Bakerloo, Northern, Circle and District lines)
- Green Park (Victoria, Piccadilly and Jubilee lines)
- London Bridge (Jubilee and Northern lines, First Capital Connect, Southeastern and Southern trains)
- Mansion House (Circle and District lines)
- St. James's Park (Circle and District lines)
- Tower Hill/Tower Gateway (Circle and District lines and c2c trains from nearby Fenchurch Street)
- Temple (Circle and District lines)
- Westminster (Jubilee, Circle and District lines)

DLR

Passengers should expect changes to routes and frequencies on certain services.

The service between Tower Gateway and Lewisham will start at 5.30am on Sunday.

For travel between Beckton and Tower Gateway, or Woolwich Arsenal and Bank, use an alternative route on Sunday as trains from Beckton and Woolwich Arsenal will terminate at Poplar.

For onward travel to Bank or Tower Gateway, passengers will need to change to a Canary Wharf train at Poplar, and then change to a Bank or Tower Gateway train at Canary Wharf.

Where possible, avoid travelling through the DLR stations west of Canning Town which are located on, or close to, the marathon route.

DLR station entry and exit points will change at Tower Gateway, Shadwell, Greenwich and Cutty Sark stations during the marathon. DLR staff will be on hand to assist customers.

Services will follow a normal Sunday timetable from 5.30pm on Sunday, until the end of service.

London Overground

The following stations are very close to the starting line so are best avoided between 7am and 11am: Surrey Quays, Canada Water (connect with the Jubilee line), Rotherhithe, Wapping and Shadwell (connect with the DLR).

Buses

A number of buses will either be diverted or will not run the full length of their route until after the event.

There are no planned works on the Circle, District, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, DLR or London Tramlink. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Bakerloo line

Part closure

Sunday: no service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone owing to Network Rail engineering work. Replacement buses will call at: Queen's Park – Kensal Green – Willesden Junction – Harlesden – Stonebridge Park – Wembley Central.

Central line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between White City and Ealing Broadway/West Ruislip owing to track replacement at East Acton and Ealing Broadway, and drainage work at White City. Replacement bus services will run:

Service A: White City (for the Hammersmith & City line to/from Wood Lane) – East Acton – North Acton – West Acton – Ealing Common (for the District and Piccadilly lines) – Ealing Broadway (for the District line and National Rail)

Service B: White City (for the Hammersmith & City line to/from Wood Lane) – North Acton – Northolt – South Ruislip (for National Rail) – Ruislip Gardens – West Ruislip (for National Rail)

Service C: White City (for the Hammersmith & City line to/from Wood Lane) – North Acton – Park Royal (for the Piccadilly line) – Hanger Lane – Perivale – Greenford – Northolt

London Overground

Part closure

Saturday: no service between Kilburn High Road and Euston owing to Network Rail work at South Hampstead station. Use local bus or Tube services via all reasonable routes (tickets will be accepted for entrance/exit at Queen's Park, Kilburn Park, Euston Square and Euston stations).

Sunday: no service between Clapham Junction and Kensington (Olympia) owing to work at Earls Court. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

Sunday: no service between Wembley Central and Euston owing to Network Rail track and station work at South Hampstead. Replacement buses will run. Between Queen's Park and Euston, use local bus or Tube services via all reasonable routes (tickets will be accepted for entrance/exit at Queen's Park, Kilburn Park, Euston Square and Euston stations).

Sunday: no service between Gospel Oak and South Tottenham owing to Network Rail work. Replacement buses will run.

Name change for Canada Water

TfL has signed a sponsorship deal that will see Canada Water Tube station renamed Buxton Water for one day – for the 35th Virgin Money London Marathon.

Canada Water roundels will be replaced by 'Buxton Water' and branded artwork will be placed throughout the station to celebrate runners taking part in the event.

The artwork will carry the hashtag #withyoualltheway to mark Buxton Water's role as the official water provider of the event. The main station entrance sign will remain unchanged.

The money TfL will receive from the deal will be reinvested to improve London's public transport and road network.
