Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned works on the Tube network, or on TfL Rail and London Trams this weekend. However, the following London Overground routes will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

London Overground

Part closure

Richmond/Clapham Junction to Stratford route

All weekend: no service between Willesden Junction and Shepherd's Bush owing to Network Rail infrastructure work. Use local buses.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Sunday: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to essential Network Rail engineering work. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road or London Underground services between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central and between East Ham and Barking. Replacement buses will run.

Gospel Oak – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill – Finsbury Park (for Piccadilly and Victoria lines) – Harringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for Victoria line)

Walthamstow Central – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham (for District and Hammersmith & City lines; eastbound stops are set down only, westbound stops are pick up only) – Barking

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

Sunday: no service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

New Cross Gate – Brockley – Honor Oak Park – Forest Hill – Sydenham – Crystal Palace – Anerley (also for Penge West) – Norwood Junction – Selhurst – West Croydon

Check your travel to ExCeL

PEOPLE planning to visit ExCeL this weekend for Grand Design Live and the National Pet Show should use Prince Regent DLR station. Royal Victoria station is a ten-minute walk away.

Custom House station is closed until late December while it is redeveloped in preparation for the new Elizabeth line which is opening next year.

Northern line improvements

TfL took advantage of the bank holiday weekend to install more than 500metres of new track on the Northern line between Burnt Oak and Colindale.

The work, which needed to be done over

three days, included the installation of a trial section of ballast containing fibrous strips.

The design aims to extend the line's life by reducing wear and tear, and preventing the movement of the stone.



It's all about cricket

FIXTURES at Lord's Cricket Ground are going to make St. John's Wood Tube station very busy this summer and customers are advised to avoid the station if possible.

Events start on Sunday with the England v Ireland one day international and those travelling to the match are encouraged to use Baker Street station and walk to the ground following the short, signed route.

Other nearby stations such as Marylebone and Warwick Avenue are less than 15 minutes away by foot.

Customers not going to the cricket should consider using Swiss Cottage to avoid queues and stairs at St. John's Wood on match days as both escalators are often switched to run on the up at busy times.

Events at Lord's will be running until September.



TRACKS and platform structures are now in place for Elizabeth line services at Abbey Wood. From December 2018, the new Elizabeth line service will halve journey times to many central London destinations.
