The Statements which had been prepared by  
each of the Managers respecting proposed Capital  
and Extraordinary expenditure for their respective  
Departments were submitted together with summarised  
precis.

The Statements of the Manager for Maintenance and  
Construction, the Operating Manager (Railways  
and Bus) and Maintenance Manager (L.G.W.) were  
carefully considered in detail and tentative decisions  
given in regard to each item contained in the  
statements.

It was resolved that the Meeting adjourn

decisions taken at this Meeting be carefully analyzed and that they be again considered at the adjourned Meeting

#### 142 Classification of Stationmasters

The Operating Manager asked if payment might now be made to Stationmasters under the new classification pointing out that such payment had already been made to Booking Clerks.

#### After discussion

It was resolved to recommend that authority be and the same is hereby given for Stationmasters to be paid in accordance with the new classification.

#### 143 Fares, proposed increase in L.C.C. Tramway Fares

The Commercial Manager pointed out that the London County Council had intimated that they were proposed to increase their fares at about Easter and asked if the London General Omnibus Company should make any alteration in their rates in consequence of the L.C.C. alterations.

It was resolved to recommend that no increase in the London General Omnibus Company's fares be made at present.

#### 144 Companies' Works Bill Clause re alternative housing

The Commercial Manager reported that the



London County Council required the same provisions to be inserted in the Bill as has been granted to the Borough of Hammersmith in respect of houses being pulled down and others being provided for the occupiers.

It was resolved to recommend that authority be given for this Clause to be approved so far as the London County Council were concerned.
