IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, DLR or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Hammersmith and Tower Hill (via King's Cross St. Pancras) owing to station improvements at Moorgate, Barbican and Liverpool Street, and track replacement work at Aldgate. Use the Hammersmith & City line between Hammersmith and King's Cross St Pancras. A special Circle line service will run between Edgware Road and Barking (via Victoria).

District line

Part closure

Sunday: no service between Turnham Green and Richmond while Network Rail carries out track work. Replacement buses will call at: Turnham Green - Chiswick Park - Gunnersbury - Royal Botanic Gardens - Richmond.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between King's Cross St. Pancras and Barking owing to station improvements at Moorgate, Barbican and Liverpool Street, and track replacement work at Aldgate. Use alternative Tube and/or bus services.

Metropolitan line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between King's Cross St. Pancras and Aldgate owing to station improvements at Moorgate, Barbican and Liverpool Street, and track replacement work at Aldgate. Use alternative Tube and/or bus services.

London Overground

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018. Replacement bus services will run between Gospel Oak and Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham), and between Walthamstow Central and Barking. At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road. Use Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

Passengers should be aware that the line is closed between South Tottenham and Barking on weekdays. Also, between Monday and Thursday next week, there will be no service between Hackney Downs and Chingford after 10.30pm. Use Tube services via all reasonable routes or the replacement buses.

Sunday: no service between Richmond and Willesden Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

TfL Rail

Part closure

Sunday: no service between Liverpool Street and Stratford owing to Network Rail track work. Use Tube services instead. Replacement buses will run between Liverpool Street and Stratford until 7.10am and after 11.50pm.

Work continues at Finsbury Park

THE Wells Terrace entrance to Finsbury Park Tube station will close on July 18.

It is part of work to improve accessibility and security, reduce congestion and help speed up journeys.

Two new lift shafts will be built to enable step-free access to all platforms and lines. New ticket gates have already been installed, and the capacity of the spiral staircases has been doubled. Future work will create a larger western entrance that will add a new step-free access route from 2019.

David Hughes, director of strategy and service development for London Underground, said: 'Finsbury Park is one of the busiest stations in north London, with over 27 million people using it every year.'

'The demand will only increase as the population of London gets larger, and the improvements being made will allow the station to deal with this demand. The introduction of larger ticket halls and step-free access will make a real, positive difference to customers' journeys.'

Temporary closure of footbridge at Epping

FROM Monday until mid-September, the footbridge at Epping station will be closed while it is strengthened and repainted.

Customers will be able to use an alternative footbridge between Hillcrest Way and Station Approach, and the gate on Hillcrest Way will

remain open all day. However, customers are advised to check which platform their train will depart from before touching in with their Oyster or contactless payment card.

There will be signs at the station and staff will keep customers informed of train departures.



A tailored talk
