Blackfriars Bridge Weekends, until December 4

Bridge closed from 9pm Friday until midnight Sunday, this weekend and next weekend, for resurfacing and maintenance works.

Wembley Stadium Saturday, 12 noon to 7pm

Heavy traffic and large crowds expected in the area for the Premier League Tottenham v West Bromwich Albion game. Kick-off is at 3pm.

Twickenham Rugby Stadium Saturday, 12 noon to 9pm

Heavy traffic and large crowds expected in the area for the England v Samoa rugby match (kick-off 3pm),

followed by the England Women v Canada Women rugby game (kick-off 5.40pm).

Travel for the Christmas show

PEOPLE heading to Olympia London for the Ideal Home Show at Christmas this week are advised to plan their travel ahead.

The nearest station is Kensington (Olympia) on the London Overground. Visitors can change to London Overground trains from the Central line at Shepherd's Bush, the District line (Wimbledon branch) at West Brompton, and the Bakerloo line at Willesden Junction.

However, due to planned engineering work all day on Sunday, there will be no London Overground service between Willesden Junction, Shepherd's Bush and Kensington (Olympia).

Also on Sunday, there will be no London Overground service between Clapham Junction and Kensington (Olympia) until around 9am. Passengers should travel to Earl's Court via the District or Piccadilly lines for alternative travel to Kensington (Olympia), or use bus 27 from Hammersmith or High Street Kensington.

A shuttle bus will run on weekdays between Earl's Court and Olympia London every seven or eight minutes and on Saturday and Sunday, District line trains will run every 15 to 20 minutes between Earl's Court and Kensington (Olympia).

The show opens today and runs until Sunday.
