IMPROVEMENTS UNDER WAY

There are no planned track works on the Bakerloo, Central, Circle, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, Docklands Light Railway, London Trams or TfL Rail. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Central line

Station closure

All weekend: Tottenham Court Road station will be closed for station improvement work in preparation for Crossrail works. Use Goodge Street or Leicester Square stations instead.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Aldgate East and Dagenham East owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel and track replacement at Stepney Green and Barking. Replacement bus services will run:

Service A: Tower Hill – Aldgate/Aldgate East – Whitechapel – Stepney Green – Mile End – Bow Road – Stratford (for other TfL and National Rail services) – Upton Park – East Ham – Barking

Service B: Mile End – Bow Road – Bromley-by-Bow – Canning Town (for the Jubilee line and Docklands Light Railway) – Plaistow – Stratford (for other TfL and National Rail services)

Service C: Barking – Upney – Becontree – Dagenham Heathway – Dagenham East

Service D: Barking – Dagenham East

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Liverpool Street and Barking owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel and track replacement at Stepney Green and Barking. Replacement bus services will run:

Service A: Tower Hill – Aldgate/Aldgate East – Whitechapel – Stepney Green – Mile End – Bow Road – Stratford (for other TfL and National Rail services) – Upton Park – East Ham – Barking

Service B: Mile End – Bow Road – Bromley-by-Bow – Canning Town (for the Jubilee line and Docklands Light Railway) – Plaistow – Stratford (for other TfL and National Rail services)

Northern line

Station closure

All weekend: Tottenham Court Road station will be closed. See the Central line entry.

London Overground

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel and Network Rail work at Highbury Corner. Use London Overground trains between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Kingsland. Replacement buses will run between Dalston Kingsland and Shadwell. Alternatively, use local bus/Tube services via all reasonable routes (for entrance/exit at Canada Water and Stratford stations only).

Saturday: no service between Surrey Quays and New Cross owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

Sunday: no service between Richmond and Willesden Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Use the District line between Richmond and Gunnersbury. Replacement buses will run between Gunnersbury and Willesden Junction.

Sunday: no service between Sydenham and Crystal Palace owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel. Use local buses via all reasonable routes or Southern services between Norwood Junction and Crystal Palace.

Sunday: no service between South Tottenham and Barking until midday owing to Network Rail infrastructure work. Replacement buses will run.

Sunday: trains to/from Chingford will not stop at Bethnal Green station until midnight owing to Network Rail track work. Customers should use Enfield Town/Cheshunt trains.

No more Tube closures until after Christmas

AFTER this weekend, planned Tube closures for improvement works will be put on hold until after Christmas. Geoff Hobbs, head of TfL's transport planning, said: 'Weekends in the run up to Christmas are among our busiest. London Underground recognises that our customers are keen to enjoy all that London has to offer in terms of shopping, entertainment and other festivities. As a result, our teams work hard to ensure minimum impact and will cease weekend closures in central London from next weekend until after Christmas.'

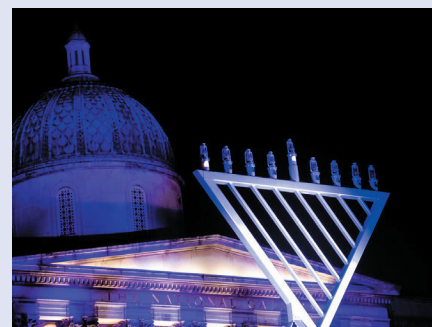


Central line to stop at Tottenham Court Road

FROM Monday, Central line trains will once again stop at Tottenham Court Road. The announcement came this week as a new glass entrance opened at the station (pictured above), marking a major milestone in its £500million upgrade. The new entrance gives customers easier access to the Northern and Central lines and is adjacent to the Centre Point building in what will become a new public plaza in 2016, offering better facilities for cyclists and improvements to bus services.

Events in Trafalgar Square

Celebrate Chanukah – see the giant menorah lit up for Chanukah, the Jewish festival of lights, in Trafalgar Square. It will be on display from midday this Sunday until 6pm on December 14,



with one of the lights lit each day. There will also be a free family celebration and lighting ceremony on December 10 from 5.30pm until 7.30pm. Entertainment will include live music from young musicians, school choirs and acapella group The Maccabeats.

Carol singing – enjoy festive tunes beneath the Christmas tree in Trafalgar Square from Monday 7 to Wednesday December 23. More than 50 carol groups will be taking part, each singing for an hour. Performances take place from 4-8pm weekdays, and 2-6pm weekends (except Thursday 10 and Wednesday December 16).
