Special Business

2525 Fees of Directors serving on General Purposes
Committee

It was reported that the subject of the fees to be
paid to Directors serving on the General Purposes

Committee had been discussed by that Committee who recommended that an amount of £1,000 be paid to the Members of the General Purposes Committee for the period from 1st October to the 31st December 1919.

It was resolved that the recommendation of the General Purposes Committee be and the same is hereby approved, and that the allocation of the amount be left in the hands of the Chairman & Managing Director.

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Fee of Solicitor of the General Purposes Committee

It was reported that the subject of the fee to be paid to the Solicitor of the General Purposes Committee for attendance at the Meetings had been discussed by the General Purposes Committee who recommended that the fee be paid at the rate of £500 per annum for the period from 1st October to 31st December 1919.

It was resolved that the recommendation of the General Purposes Committee be and the same is hereby approved and that Mr L. B. Garslake be paid a fee at the rate of £500 per annum for attendance at the General Purposes Committee for the period from 1st October to 31st December 1919

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Bills in Parliament Session 1920

The Chairman and Managing Director reported that he was meeting the London Members of Parliament at the House of Commons on Wednesday

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The 3rd inst in regard to the Companies' Fares Bills. There was a general feeling in the mind of the travelling public that the maximum rates of fare asked for in the Bills were too high and consideration was being given to the question of alternative proposals in regard to reducing the maximum rates, and instead of abolishing Workmen's Fares, agreeing to charge the ordinary single fare for the return journey. A further report on this matter would be made at the next Meeting of the Board.

Financial Statements

- a. Traffic Statements for the week ending 21st February 1920 and for the period from 1st January to 21st February 1920 were submitted and discussed.
- b. Operating Statement showing the provisional figures for the month of January 1920 was submitted and discussed.
- c. Cash Statement to the 24th February 1920 showing a credit balance of £1432. 9. 8 and Treasury Bills amounting to £77,000 was submitted.

It was resolved that the drawing of cheques since the Board Meeting held on the 3rd February 1920 be approved and confirmed.

Merchants Trust Ltd

- The Treasurer reported that the Merchants Trust Ltd had withdrawn £15,000 of Victory Bonds from the securities lodged against the loan with the London General Omnibus Co Ltd and that approved securities had been substituted therefor.
- d. A Statement showing the capital position of the Company was also submitted.

Renewal of 5% 3 year Secured Notes

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The Deputy Chairman reported he had prepared a memorandum showing a basis for negotiating for the renewal of the £,000,000 of 5% 3 year Secured Notes which fall due for redemption on the 30th March 1920. It was not possible to state the exact terms on which these notes might be renewed but it would probably be on the basis of nearly 8 per cent.

Staff matters

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National Transport Workers Federation
The Operating Manager reported that an application had been received from the National Transport Workers Federation demanding an additional increase of ten shillings per week for the Members of their Union. This would affect the London General Omnibus Company Limited to the extent of approximately £446,000 a year. Negotiations had not yet taken place, and a further report would be made.

Improvements

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New Office Building

The Chairman and Managing Director stated that he had received a report from the Chairman of the Building Sub Committee in this matter, and he was of the opinion that the estimated cost was so prohibitive that it would not be wise to proceed with the proposed scheme of building on the site facing the Broadway Westminster. The matter would be further considered and a report made at a subsequent meeting.
