THERE will be no train services stopping at Tower Hill this Saturday and Sunday.

From East London, use the Circle or District lines to Aldgate or Aldgate East, or take the DLR to Tower Gateway. All are a short walk away. Otherwise, use the Northern or Jubilee lines to get to London

Bridge and either walk, take the bus or use Barclays Cycle Hire.

For directions, see the posters and signs at nearby stations or, where possible, pick up a walking map from a TfL ambassador.

Going to Arsenal vs Burnley?

HIGHBURY & Islington station is expected to be particularly busy tomorrow following the match at Emirates Stadium. To avoid delays, customers should make the return journey via Archway or Angel stations using the signed walking routes. There are managed queuing systems in place at Arsenal and Finsbury Park stations and King's Cross St. Pancras also offers a useful alternative. Customers using Highbury & Islington should approach the station by walking along Holloway Road.

Embankment station open for business

BAKERLOO and Northern line services will once again stop at Embankment station from tomorrow morning.

Passengers on the two lines have not been able to use the station since January while the escalators, last refurbished in the 1970s, were being replaced.

Work on all the escalators happened simultaneously so it took just 43 weeks to complete, rather than 75 weeks had it been phased. During the closure, TfL also

took the opportunity to refurbish other parts of the station. Corridors and platforms were re-tiled, new lighting installed and station Help Points and CCTV systems replaced.

The work was essential to ensure the continued safe operation of the station.

Customers are advised that there are no Circle or District line services through the station this weekend owing to planned drainage replacement work. The station will be open, to all lines, on Monday morning.

There are no planned works on the Central, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, or Docklands Light Railway. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Bakerloo line

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone while platform extension work is carried out at Willesden Junction. There will also be no London Overground service between Queen's Park and Wembley Central. Replacement buses will call at: Queen's Park – Kensal Green – Willesden Junction – North Acton (for the Central line) – Harlesden – Stonebridge Park – Wembley Central.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Gloucester Road and Aldgate (via Embankment). This is for improvements at Victoria station and track and drainage replacement at Blackfriars. Trains will run between Aldgate and Hammersmith (via King's Cross St. Pancras), and between Edgware Road and Gloucester Road (via High Street Kensington). Use alternative Tube and/or bus routes.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: No service between South Kensington and Aldgate East. This is for improvements at Victoria station and track and drainage replacement at Blackfriars. Also, there will be no service between Turnham Green and Richmond owing to track replacement and line improvement work at Richmond. Replacement buses will call at: Turnham Green – Chiswick Park – Gunnersbury – Royal Botanical Gardens (Victoria Gate) – Richmond.

London Overground

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Richmond and Willesden Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

All weekend: No service between Wembley Central and Queen's Park while platform extension work is carried out at Willesden Junction. Rail replacement buses will run.

All weekend: No service between Sydenham and West Croydon owing to Network Rail bridge work. Replacement buses will run.

London Tramlink

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Mitcham Junction and Ampere Way while track construction work takes place near Beddington Lane. Replacement buses will call at: Mitcham Junction – Beddington Lane – Therapia Lane – Ampere Way. Trams from Wimbledon will terminate at Mitcham Junction. Trams from New Addington will terminate at Therapia Lane and Line 4 will not run. Journeys between Wimbledon and Croydon will take around 30 minutes longer so customers may find it easier to use an alternative route. Tram tickets will be accepted on the replacement and local buses. Oyster pay as you go customers can receive a refund if they touch in correctly.

Sunday, from 8pm: Trams from Wimbledon will terminate at Mitcham. The replacement bus service will be extended to Mitcham. Normal service resumes on Monday.
