

Barclays Cycle hire expansion

BARCLAYS Cycle Hire is expanding to South-West London on December 13.

More than 150 extra docking stations will be available in the new area and across the existing scheme. All additional docking stations are expected to be up and running by next spring.

The expansion will result in more than 2,000 new bicycles and around 5,000 additional docking points, almost half of which will be south of the Thames.

There will also be in the region of 1,000 new docking points installed in the existing area covered by the scheme where demand is highest. Construction and installation of



new docking stations is under way with several new ones already operating.

These include:

- Addison Road in Kensington & Chelsea
- St Martin's Close in Camden
- Evesham Street in Kensington & Chelsea

Docking points and new stations will continue to be added in areas of high demand over the next few weeks, before the main South-West London launch.

As of November 2013, there have been 26 million journeys made on Barclays Cycle Hire bikes since the start of the scheme in July 2010.

The new area will include parts of Wandsworth, Hammersmith & Fulham, Lambeth and Kensington & Chelsea.



Tram improvement works

OWING to improvement works there will be two separate closures on London Tramlink.

Sandilands – New Addington: There will be no service between Sandilands and New Addington from 10pm Wednesday to December 8.

Replacement bus services: Trams from Wimbledon will terminate at East Croydon and a replacement bus service will run between New Addington and East Croydon (Dingwall Road) stopping at: King Henry's Drive – Fieldway – Addington Village – Gravel Hill – Coombe Lane – Sandilands.

New Addington – Addington Village: There will be no service between New Addington and Addington Village from December 9 to December 12.

Replacement bus services: A normal tram service will operate

to/from Addington Village. A replacement bus service will run between New Addington and Addington Village stopping at King Henry's Drive and Fieldway.

Valid tickets will be accepted on the replacement buses and local bus services. Oyster pay as you go customers will receive a refund if they touch in correctly when boarding and interchanging between trams and buses.

Please allow extra time to complete your journey during these closures.

The work, which includes track replacement, system maintenance and road resurfacing, is essential to ensure that the tram service remains safe and reliable.
