It's happy birthday to the Docklands Light Railway this month as the network notches up 30 years.



To celebrate, TfL has launched a leaflet helping people to discover more about the area around Docklands and East London.

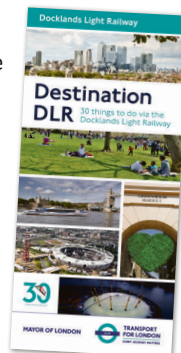
Called 'Destination DLR - 30 things to do via the Docklands Light Railway', it gives details of what to see, where to go, and places to eat and drink for great family days out.

There's also some history for those who like to soak up the atmosphere, information on cultural attractions and activities to help people explore the neighbourhood out of doors.

The DLR was regarded as a novelty when it was opened by Her Majesty The Queen in the summer of 1987 (pictured left). Since then, the driverless light railway has had a front seat view of the changing landscape in East London during the area's regeneration.

Today, the district has become a vibrant, thriving part of London, packed with some well-known attractions and interesting hidden gems.

South Lambeth Road

Until July 31, 6.30am

Weekend lane closures at the junction of Harleyford Road, from 10pm Friday to 6.30am Monday, for crane operations.

A4 West Cromwell Road

Lane restrictions, westbound, between Earl's Court Road and Templeton Place for structural works.

Chelsea Embankment

Friday, 9.30pm to Monday, 2pm

Road closed, westbound, between Chelsea Bridge Road and Battersea Bridge for utility works.

Hertford Road, Enfield

Sunday, midnight to September 1, midnight

High Street, Ponders End Road closed at the junction of Lincoln Road, together with other lane restrictions and temporary traffic signals for a junction improvement scheme.

Central London

Saturday, 11.30pm to Sunday, 6.30pm

Road closures between the ExCeL Centre and central London for the London Triathlon, including Royal Albert Way, Lower Lea Crossing, Limehouse Link Tunnel, Upper and Lower Thames Streets, and Victoria Embankment.
