**Gabriel's Wharf, South Bank**  
Good Friday to Easter Monday, 11am-6pm

While the grown-ups browse the market stalls, children are invited to



search for hidden chocolatey treats at Gabriel's Wharf. On Saturday,

Easter-themed craft activities are available between 1pm- 4pm.

**Epping Ongar Railway**  
Good Friday to Easter Monday

Guided by Bertie the bunny, children can hunt around the preserved railway for ten hidden eggs while exploring steam trains, buses and other modes of transport. Activities include face painting and a disco for the kids, while adults can enjoy a cup of tea.

Easter Saturday, performances between 10am-3pm

Take a trip to Ellie's Castle – when the rain turns to chocolate, the audience is called upon to take part in an interactive performance to help Ellie solve the clues to get through her Easter journey.

**Jubilee Market, Covent Garden**  
Good Friday and Easter Sunday, 11am-3pm

Families are encouraged to make their way to Jubilee Market where they can search for hidden eggs before exchanging them with the Easter bunny for delicious nibbles. The nearby stalls are worth a look too.

**Kensington Roof Gardens**  
Easter Sunday, starts 11.45am

Situated 100ft above Kensington High Street, families can enjoy a relaxing day at The Roof

Gardens. Kids can roam the 1.5 acres for chocolate eggs while grown-ups sit back and relax with a cocktail from the bar.

**Tadworth Court, Surrey**  
Easter Saturday, midday-4pm

The Children's Trust Easter Fair invites families to enjoy an Easter egg hunt, DJ and shopping market while at the same time raising money for the charity.

## Museum fun


Special family events are being held at London Transport Museum this Easter.

## Traffic information for the capital

**St George's Circus**  
Until April 15, 6am

Lambeth Road closed and St George's Circus reduced to two lanes for Cycle Superhighway construction works. Lane restrictions on Waterloo Road and Westminster Bridge Road.

**Euston Road and Pentonville Road**  
Until April 26, 6pm

Lane restrictions in the area and King's Cross Bridge is closed while work continues on the King's Cross Better Junctions scheme. Further lane restrictions this weekend on Pentonville Road between York Way and Caledonian Road.

**Haymarket**  
Until August 28, 5pm

Southbound carriageway reduced to one lane between Coventry Street and Jermyn Street and lanes closed from Charles II Street for work on the Piccadilly Two-Way scheme. No right turn from Haymarket into Pall Mall East.

**Hounslow Road**  
April 1, 7am to August 28, 5pm

Road closed at the junction of Hanworth Road for work on high street improvement scheme.

**Duke Street Hill**  
April 3, 1am to April 7, 5am

Road closed between Tooley Street and Borough High Street for Network Rail works. Diversions will be in place.
