


Chancery Lane station improvement works

CHANCERY Lane Tube station will be closed on three consecutive Sundays between November 17 and December 1, and between Christmas Day and December 30, while improvement works are carried out.

Walls, floors and tiling will be spruced up and woodwork re-painted at the Central line station. New cables will also be installed to support extra lighting and an updated PA system.

Customers are being advised to use Holborn station, which is approximately a 10-minute walk along High Holborn. Alternatively any bus from stop F on High Holborn goes to Holborn.

World Travel Market – plan your journey

A MAJOR trade event, the World Travel Market, is taking place at the ExCeL from today until Thursday.

Public transport serving the venue, particularly the Docklands Light Railway (DLR), will be busier than normal during morning and evening peak travel times.

To make your journey easier when travelling to ExCeL, consider taking the DLR from Tower Gateway, which connects to the District and Circle lines, rather than from Bank, which will be very busy. If you are travelling in the evening, avoid changing trains at Canning Town. Take the DLR to Tower Gateway and continue your journey from there.

The DLR from Custom House and Prince Regent stations towards central London will be very busy between 4.30pm and 6pm so avoid travelling between these times if possible. If you travel between Bank and Woolwich Arsenal in the evening peak, you'll need to change trains at Poplar as there will be no direct services at



that time of the day.

If you're travelling to or from central London, you could avoid congestion hotspots (and take in some great sights) by taking London River Services from locations including Westminster, Embankment and London Bridge. Alternatively, you could take the

Jubilee line to North Greenwich and then cross the Thames on the Emirates Air Line cable car.
