

Plan your weekend travel

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria, and Waterloo & City lines, or the DLR. However, engineering and improvement work will affect the following services:

Circle line Part closure

All weekend: no service between Hammersmith/High Street Kensington and Baker Street, owing to engineering works. Use alternative Tube routes or local buses instead. Trains will run between High Street Kensington and Barking (via Victoria), and between High Street Kensington and Baker Street (via Aldgate).

District line Part closure

All weekend: no service between High Street Kensington and Edgware Road, owing to engineering works. Use local buses instead.

There is no service before 9am and after 9pm between Kensington (Olympia) and Earl's Court owing to engineering works. Use local buses instead.

Hammersmith & City line Part closure

All weekend: no service between Hammersmith and Baker Street, owing to engineering works. Use alternative Tube routes or local buses instead.

London Overground Part closure

Romford to Upminster route

All weekend: no service between Romford and Upminster. Use local bus route 370 instead.

Richmond and Clapham Junction to Stratford route

Sunday: no service until 11.30am between Richmond/Shepherd's Bush and Camden Road, owing to engineering works. Use the District line between Richmond, Kew Gardens and Gunnersbury, and local bus routes 220 or 228 between Shepherd's Bush and Willesden Junction.

Replacement buses will run between Gunnersbury and Camden Road:

- Gunnersbury – South Acton – Acton Central – Willesden Junction – Kensal Rise – Queen's Park (for Bakerloo line and bus connections to Brondesbury Park) – Brondesbury – West Hampstead – Finchley Road Underground (for Finchley Road & Frognal) – Hampstead Heath – Gospel Oak (Agincourt Road/Southampton Road) – Kentish Town West – Camden Road

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Sunday: No eastbound service until 9am owing to Network Rail infrastructure work.

TfL Rail Full closure

All weekend: no service on the line between Liverpool Street and Shenfield, owing to engineering works. Use Central line services between Liverpool Street and Newbury Park. Replacement buses will run between Stratford and Romford, and Newbury Park and Shenfield:

- Service A: Stratford City – Forest Gate (Romford Road) – Manor Park (Romford Road) – Ilford – Seven Kings – Goodmayes – Chadwell Heath (Wangey Road) – Romford
- Service B: Newbury Park (for Central line) – Chadwell Heath (Wangey Road) – Romford – Gidea Park – Harold Wood – Brentwood – Shenfield

London Trams Part closure

All weekend: no service between Wimbledon and Dundonald Road, owing to National Rail work as part of the Wimbledon line enhancement. Trams will terminate at Dundonald Road, which is about a ten-minute walk from Wimbledon station.

The following local buses connect Wimbledon with London Trams:

Merton Park – Wimbledon: 163 and 164

Morden Road – Wimbledon: 93

Emirates Air Line Full closure

Next week: From Monday 12 until Sunday March 18, the Emirates Air Line will be closed while planned maintenance work is carried out.

Step-free coming to South Kensington

SOUTH Kensington Tube station will be upgraded as part of a plan to develop the surrounding land, with TfL announcing development company Native Land as its preferred joint venture partner.

The development will be respectful to the character of the local area, which forms a gateway to one of London's most popular cultural hotspots, and will provide step-free access to the District and Circle line platforms via a new entrance on Thurloe Street.

The scheme will also improve access to the pedestrian subway leading to local destinations, including the Science Museum, Imperial College, the Natural History Museum and the Victoria and Albert Museum.

Located in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, South Kensington is one of the busiest stations on the Underground network. More than 34 million District, Circle and Piccadilly line customers a year use it to travel to London's museum quarter.

The development will also improve the properties around the station, with the potential to create new opportunities on TfL land from Pelham Street to Thurloe Square. The site also includes the main station entrances



through the Grade II-listed shopping arcade, which will be preserved and restored, and a second entrance via the Grade II-listed pedestrian subway.

Tram track work this Easter

CUSTOMERS on London Trams can expect a more reliable service following essential track upgrade work, taking place in Croydon.

The upgrade work involves replacing tracks between George Street and Church Street, and from the junction of Cherry Orchard Road to Addiscombe Road.

Throughout the work, there will be no tram services from Reeves Corner to Sandilands from Friday March 30 until Wednesday April 4, and from East Croydon to Sandilands from Friday March 30 until Sunday April 8.

A replacement bus service will run from Friday March 30 to Wednesday April 4 between Waddon Marsh and Sandilands tram stops, also stopping at Vicarage Road for Wandle Park. Customers for intermediate stops should use existing bus routes.

Full tram services will resume on Monday April 9. This work forms part of a wider programme of routine track replacement.
