the Paris Committee on 5<sup>th</sup> inst. Resolved that  
the Paris Committee be referred to Minutes of  
20<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of Executive Committee, related  
to the horse purchases, and that they be informed  
that arrangements are being urged forward for  
the complete centralisation of the horse purchase  
department, and that as soon as practicable it  
will be accomplished - that it is inexpedient and  
unnecessary to attempt such an arrangement hastily



and run the risk of failure and discredit.  
That the Board entirely concurs in the general  
views of their Paris colleagues as to the purchase  
of businesses of private proprietors and have  
been guided by them in all purchases hitherto  
made.

That the Board are convinced that it is not  
expedient either as a question of cost or policy  
to enter into contracts for supplies of Oats, but  
that they would large purchases of such a supply  
as will serve the Company for a lengthened  
period - that in their opinion such is the  
proper course for the Company to take - that the  
Board will nevertheless be glad to receive from  
their colleagues information of the prices at  
which the Paris Committee Company has made  
its contracts and the price at which similar  
corn can be purchased in the open competing  
markets at the present time with a view to a  
fuller consideration of the subject.

£714.10.0, that 210 barcases were sold for  
£36.10.0, and 9 living horses for £39.10.0,  
that 2080 grs. of Oats at £1.0.3<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 150 grs. of  
Barley at £0.11.3<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 102 loads of Hay and  
clover at £3.15.0<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, and 97<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> loads of Straw  
at £1.12.7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> were purchased - that the prices in  
the corresponding week of 1862 were for Oats,  
proportionate to their weight £1.3.2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, for Hay



and clover £4.8.0 and for brass £2.1.1,  
yielding by comparison a difference in favor  
of the current year equal to £588 on the  
average weekly consumption of the company.
