

Plan ahead for the weekend

For travel advice to help you make the most of London, visit tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned works on the Central, Jubilee, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines this Bank Holiday weekend. There are also no planned works on the DLR or London Trams. However, engineering and improvement work will affect the following services:

Bakerloo line Part closure

Sunday: No service between Stonebridge Park and Harrow & Wealdstone, owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will operate.

Circle line Full closure

Saturday to Monday: No service throughout the line for modernisation work. Use alternative Tube routes or local buses.

District line Part closure

Saturday to Monday: No service between Tower Hill and West Ham for modernisation work. Replacement buses will run, or use c2c services to/from Fenchurch Street.

Hammersmith & City line Part closure

Saturday to Monday: No service between Kings Cross St Pancras and Barking for modernisation work. Replacement buses will operate.

Metropolitan line Part closure

Saturday to Monday: No service between Kings Cross St Pancras and Aldgate for modernisation work. Use alternative Tube routes or local buses.

London Overground Part closure

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/ Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

Saturday and Sunday: No service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon owing to Network Rail track and infrastructure work. Replacement buses will operate.

Saturday to Monday: Trains will not stop at Whitechapel owing to Crossrail construction work. Use local buses instead.

Sunday: No service between Surrey Quays and New Cross from 8.45pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use bus route 225 or services from New Cross Gate station instead.

Sunday: No service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell from 9.15pm, owing to Crossrail construction work. Use alternative London Overground trains between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Kingsland, or local buses between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Junction. Replacement buses will operate between Dalston Kingsland and Shadwell.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Sunday: No service between South Tottenham and Barking until noon, owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will operate between Walthamstow Central and Barking (at East Ham, eastbound buses will stop to set down only and westbound buses will stop to pick up only).

Use local buses or London Underground services between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central.

Watford Junction to Euston route

Sunday: No service between Harrow & Wealdstone and Queen's Park, owing to Network Rail track work. Use London Northwestern Railway services between Harrow & Wealdstone and Euston.

Replacement buses will operate between Harrow & Wealdstone and Stonebridge Park. Use the Bakerloo line between Stonebridge Park and Queen's Park.

Romford to Upminster route

Sunday: No service between Romford and Upminster for Crossrail construction work. Use local buses instead.

TfL Rail Part closure

Sunday: No service between Chadwell Heath and Shenfield owing to track maintenance and major project work. Replacement buses will operate.

London Overground closures next week

FROM Tuesday until Thursday, there will be no London Overground service after 10.30pm between Sydenham and West Croydon. This is owing to Network Rail track work.

Rail replacement buses will run from Norwood Junction to West Croydon via Selhurst, before continuing to Epsom Downs. Use Southern services to travel between Sydenham and Norwood Junction.

Getting out and about

THERE'S plenty to see and do in London this Bank Holiday weekend. Here is MetroTravel's guide to some of the hottest happenings, with advice on how to get there.

Cinco de Mayo

This Saturday, Pop Brixton hosts a fiesta to celebrate Cinco de Mayo. The free festivities start at noon and include traditional dance and music, DJ sets and Mexican-inspired food and décor.

Getting there: Pop Brixton is a short walk from Brixton Tube station (Victoria line) and National Rail station. A number of local buses stop nearby.

Canalway Calvacade

Steer yourself to Little Venice for this popular free waterways festival, which runs across the

weekend. Watch the colourful boats float by in a pageant (Saturday 2pm), browse the stalls and enjoy activities for all the family. For a bit of added sparkle, head over on Sunday and enjoy the illuminated procession, which starts at 9pm.

Getting there: Paddington (Bakerloo, Circle and District lines) and Warwick Avenue (Bakerloo line) are the nearest Tube stations (see above for details of Bakerloo line closures). A number of bus services also stop near to the towpath.

Alchemy Festival

Now in its ninth year, Alchemy is a celebration of the cultural connections between South Asia and the UK. Head to the Southbank Centre over the Bank Holiday weekend for a range of music, dance, comedy, literature and street food.

Getting there: The nearest Tube stations are Waterloo (Bakerloo, Jubilee, Northern and Waterloo & City lines) and Embankment (Bakerloo, District and Northern lines – see above for details of line closures). Several bus routes stop within walking distance and Thames Clippers serve London Eye Pier nearby. There are Santander Cycles docking stations on Concert Hall Approach.
