weeks to go until the Northern line joins the Night Tube network

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, DLR or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Baker Street and Hammersmith/High Street Kensington owing to track replacement work at Paddington, Latimer Road and Edgware Road. Trains will run between High Street Kensington and Baker Street (via Aldgate), and between High Street Kensington and Barking (via Victoria). Replacement buses will call at: Baker Street – Edgware Road – Paddington – Royal Oak – Westbourne Park – Ladbrooke Grove – Latimer Road – Shepherd's Bush (for the Central line) – Shepherd's Bush Green (for Shepherd's Bush Market and Goldhawk Road) – Hammersmith. Customers for Wood Lane should use nearby White City station on the Central line.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Edgware Road and High Street Kensington, or between Earl's Court and Kensington (Olympia). This is while track replacement and station improvement work takes place at Edgware Road. Use alternative Tube, London Overground and/or bus services.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Baker Street and Hammersmith owing to track replacement work at Paddington, Latimer Road and Edgware Road. See the Circle line entry for replacement bus information.

London Overground

Part closure

Richmond/Clapham Junction to Stratford route

Sunday: no service between Willesden Junction and Camden Road until 11.30am owing to Network Rail track work. Use local bus or Tube services between Willesden Junction and Camden Road via all reasonable routes – entrance/exit at Willesden Junction, West Hampstead and Camden Town stations only.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Until February: no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018. Replacement buses will run:

Service J: Gospel Oak (bus stops in Highgate Road) – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill (bus stops in Hornsey Road) – Finsbury Park (Tube) – Harringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham).

Service T: Walthamstow Central – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road (bus stops at Harrow Green) – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham (Tube) – Barking.

At East Ham, eastbound buses stop will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road. Use Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

Romford to Upminster route

All weekend: no service between Romford and Upminster owing to Crossrail and Network Rail infrastructure work. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

TfL Rail

Part closure

All weekend: on Saturday there will be no service between Stratford and Shenfield until 8pm when the closure will extend from Liverpool Street to Shenfield for the rest of the weekend. This is owing to Crossrail construction work and Network Rail carrying out track and station improvements. Replacement bus services will run:

- Stratford – Forest Gate – Manor Park – Ilford – Seven Kings – Goodmayes – Chadwell Heath – Romford
- Newbury Park (for the Central line) – Chadwell Heath – Romford – Gidea Park – Harold Wood – Brentwood – Shenfield

Step-free access at Vauxhall



VAUXHALL is the latest Tube station to offer step-free access, with two new lifts now serving both Victoria line platforms. Nearby Vauxhall bus station, the second busiest in London, is also step-free which means customers can now change from buses on to the Tube, opening up many more journeys across the capital for those who need level access.

There are now 70 Underground stations with step-free access across the network.

Have your say on buses services



STRATFORD bus station will open its doors to the public on Sunday between 11am and 4pm to encourage people to go along and give their views on local bus services.

Staff from London Buses will be available to discuss routes and talk through proposed changes to services in the area. The free event is part of a community day designed to promote closer links between the bus company and their customers.

While at the depot, visitors will also be able to climb on board one of the latest electric buses and get up close to a TfL incident response vehicle. Cyclists can also get advice from police officers about preventing theft.
