

# Travel information for the strike



TfL is once again working hard to keep the capital moving and open for business as the second of two 48-hour strikes by the RMT and TSSA is planned to begin this evening.

If the industrial action goes ahead, it will start at around 9pm and will cause disruption to journeys on Wednesday and Thursday. Tube services will start later and finish earlier than normal. Where TfL can operate services, trains will run from around 7am and are expected to conclude around 11pm, with no service beyond that. However, customers are advised that the last services from central London may depart significantly earlier than this, at around 9.30pm.

Services are expected to return to normal on Friday morning.

During last week's strike, TfL managed to run more than a third of normal services, serving around 70 per cent of stations on eight out of 11 lines. A similar service is expected to run this week. The situation may change so customers should check [tfl.gov.uk](http://tfl.gov.uk) before they travel.

Trains expected to run include:

## Central line

Between Holborn and Leytonstone/Epping/Hainault via Newbury Park and Woodford around every ten minutes in both directions, and between West Ruislip/Ealing Broadway and White City around every 15 minutes in both directions. No service to operate through the central area.

## Circle line

See District line, Hammersmith & City line and Metropolitan line.

## District line

Between Upminster and Wimbledon every six minutes in both directions and between Ealing Broadway and High Street Kensington around every 20 minutes in both directions.

## Hammersmith & City line

Every ten minutes in both directions between Hammersmith and Moorgate stations.

## Jubilee line

Around every ten minutes in both directions between Stanmore and Finchley Road, and between Waterloo and Stratford.

## Metropolitan line

Every seven minutes in both directions between Harrow-on-the-Hill and Aldgate.

## Northern line

Trains to run across the entire line (except to Mill Hill East), with a service around every four minutes via Bank and Charing Cross branches in both directions.

## Piccadilly line

Trains will run between Acton Town and Heathrow Terminals 1,2,3, and between Arncliffe Grove and Cockfosters around every 12 minutes in both directions. No service through the central area.

## Victoria line

Approximately every five minutes in both directions between Seven Sisters and Brixton.

## Other services

There will be more than 100 extra buses with TfL Ambassadors and volunteers on hand at bus stations and transport hubs to help people plan their route. Walking maps will be provided online, in bus, rail, and Tube stations in Zone 1 and other key outer London stations.

London River Services and several coach operators will offer enhanced services. London Overground, Docklands Light Railway and Barclays Cycle Hire will operate as normal.

## Tube improvements – post weekend update



### Metropolitan and Piccadilly lines:

- 136metres of new drainage were renewed in the Hillingdon area
- 650metres of track were replaced in the Ruislip area
- Points work took place at Ruislip

A total of 4,750metres of Metropolitan line track has been replaced since Christmas. All this work is improving the reliability and comfort of journeys.

**Jubilee line:** Tunnel strengthening work took place between Bond Street and Baker Street

**Northern line:** New signalling was tested on the Kennington-Morden branch of the line
