There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, Circle, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, Docklands Light Railway or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works this weekend.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Aldgate East and Dagenham East owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel, track and drainage replacement work at East Ham and station improvements at Stepney Green. c2c services will be diverted to/from Liverpool Street and will not serve Fenchurch Street, Limehouse or West Ham. Replacement bus services will run:

Service A: Tower Hill – Aldgate/Aldgate East – Whitechapel – Stepney Green – Mile End – Bow Road – Stratford (for the Central and Jubilee lines, London Overground, National Rail, TfL Rail and DLR) – Upton Park – East Ham – Barking

Service B: Mile End – Bow Road – Bromley-by-Bow – Canning Town – Plaistow – Stratford (for the Central and Jubilee lines, London Overground, National Rail, TfL Rail and DLR)

Service C: Barking – Upney – Becontree – Dagenham Heathway – Dagenham East

Service D: Barking – Dagenham East

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Liverpool Street and Barking owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel, track and drainage replacement work at East Ham and station improvements at Stepney Green. See the District line entry for information on replacement bus services.

London Overground

Part closure

Saturday: no service between Sydenham and Crystal Palace owing to Crossrail works. Use Southern services.

All weekend: no service between Highbury & Islington and Shadwell owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel. Use London Overground trains between Highbury & Islington and Dalston Kingsland or local buses via all reasonable routes. Use Tube services via all reasonable routes (for entrance/exit at Canada Water and Stratford stations only). Replacement buses will also run.

All weekend: no London Overground service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail infrastructure work. Replacement bus services will run.

Sunday: no service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon owing to Network Rail infrastructure work. Replacement buses will run.

One-minute silence for terror victims

TfL and its services will observe a one-minute silence at midday today to remember the victims of last week's terrorist attack in Tunisia. Thirty-eight people, including 30 Britons, lost their lives in the resort of Port El Kantaoui, just north of Sousse.



Plan ahead for major work that will improve Victoria line services

PASSENGERS are being reminded to plan their journeys ahead of service changes on the Victoria line next month.

From Saturday August 8 to Sunday August 30, northbound Victoria line trains will only go as far as Seven Sisters. Services between Seven Sisters and Brixton will also run less frequently. This is to enable improvements to be carried out. Various alternative travel options will be available.

The three-week closure means that other stations on the Victoria line will be busier, as will parts of the Central line and London Overground.

The nature and scale of the work means

it is not possible to carry it out during the very limited engineering hours available at nights and at weekends.

Currently, only 24 trains an hour can be run beyond Seven Sisters owing to the layout of the points at Walthamstow Central crossover, which transfers northbound trains to the southbound line for their return journey. Renewal of the crossover is essential to achieve 36 trains an hour next year.

Finsbury Park during the Wireless Festival

UP to 45,000 festival-goers are expected in Finsbury Park for concerts this evening, tomorrow and Sunday night. The nearest Tube stations are Finsbury Park (Victoria line) and Manor House (Piccadilly line). They will be busier than normal with queuing systems in place after the concert. National Rail will run fast trains from Finsbury Park to King's Cross St. Pancras. You will find it easier changing between London Underground and National Rail services at King's Cross St. Pancras.



Working towards a better Tube

LAST weekend, as part of the Tube improvement programme, a closure on the District line enabled 520metres of track to be replaced at Ealing Common. Track improvements were also carried out at West Kensington and work on the Richmond branch helped to prepare the lines for longer London Overground and District line trains.
