

Plan your weekend travel

Find out about line closures and alternative travel options at tfl.gov.uk

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, Central, District, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria and Waterloo & City lines, or the TfL Rail and London Trams networks. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Circle line

Part closure

All weekend: no service between Edgware Road and Hammersmith while new signalling is tested and track replaced at Latimer Road. A circular service will operate Edgware Road – Aldgate – Edgware Road in both directions. Use alternative Tube lines or local buses.

Hammersmith & City line

Part closure

All weekend: no trains between Edgware Road and Hammersmith while new signalling is tested and track replaced at Latimer Road. Use alternative Tube lines or local buses.

London Overground

Part closure

Richmond/Clapham Junction to Stratford route

Sunday: no service between Camden Road and Stratford owing to bridge replacement work at Highbury Corner and Network Rail station work at Hackney Wick. Replacement buses will run.

Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

Sunday: no service until 10.15am between Wandsworth Road and Clapham Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Trains will run along an alternative route to/from Battersea Park instead of Clapham Junction. Use local buses or Southern services between Clapham Junction and Battersea Park.

Gospel Oak to Barking route

Sunday: no service until 12 noon between South Tottenham and Barking owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run between Walthamstow Central and Barking. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road or London Underground services between Seven Sisters and Walthamstow Central.

Liverpool Street to Enfield Town/Cheshunt (via Seven Sisters)/Chingford route

Sunday: no southbound service until 7am between Chingford and Liverpool Street owing to Network Rail track work. Use Tube services or local buses.

Sunday: trains to/from Chingford will not stop at Bethnal Green owing to Network Rail track work. Use Enfield Town/Cheshunt trains.

DLR

Station closed

Until December: trains will not be stopping at Custom House while station work takes place to prepare for the start of Elizabeth line services. Use local buses.

Metropolitan improvements

PASSENGERS using the Metropolitan line will get a more reliable train service following the installation of two new crossovers on track near Harrow-on-the-Hill over Easter.

The engineering work will allow trains to switch between fast and local lines more quickly – at

50mph rather than the current 20 to 30mph – and accelerate away from the station faster.

Once signalling has also been upgraded, the new points will allow more trains to run on the Metropolitan line, giving passengers a more frequent service.

Easter rail works

NETWORK Rail installed more than 5.6km of overhead wire at Seven Kings over the Easter bank holiday weekend, helping to improve reliability on the TfL Rail route. Around 270metres of track was also renewed

at Pudding Mill Lane and new signalling equipment tested at Shenfield to prepare for the introduction of new, more spacious trains. Work progressed on making step-free access at Harold Wood and Forest Gate stations.

FA Cup action

HEAVY traffic and large crowds are expected around Wembley Stadium for the FA Cup semi-finals this weekend.

The action starts at 5.15pm on Saturday with Tottenham Hotspur v Chelsea, followed by Manchester City v Arsenal at 3pm on Sunday.



Plan ahead for Marathon day

WITH the Virgin Money London Marathon taking place on Sunday, TfL is urging runners, spectators and motorists to plan their journeys to avoid disruption.

Many roads will be closed, with central London particularly affected, as well as several changes to bus services. Many stations are also expected to be busier than usual.

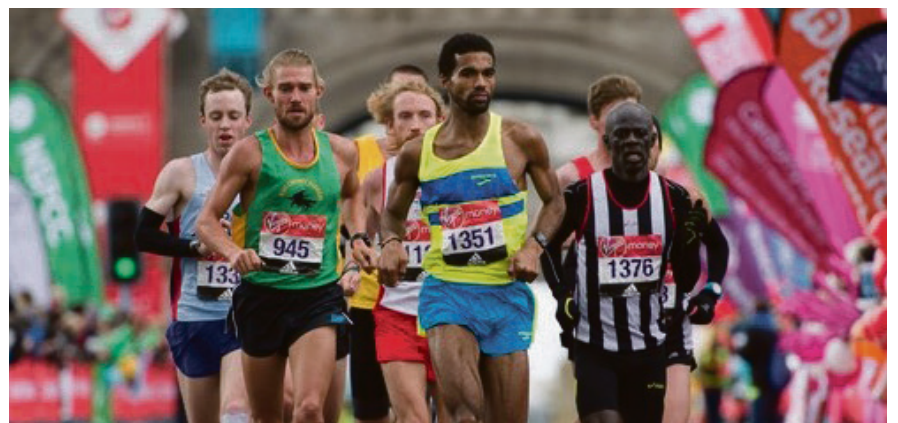
Some roads have already closed and will remain shut until Tuesday, owing to enhanced security measures.

The Marathon route takes runners past some of the capital's most famous landmarks so visitors are advised to plan their day carefully. People are urged to avoid the busy areas, in particular Greenwich town centre, Cutty Sark and Tower Bridge.

From 6am, there will be a number of road closures in south-east and central London, from Greenwich Park to St James's Park. Central and City closures will include all approaches to Upper Thames Street, Tower Hill and Victoria Embankment. Rotherhithe Tunnel will also be closed, along with Tower, Southwark and Westminster Bridges.

Motorists are advised to plan ahead and if possible avoid driving near the affected areas or travel at a different time and allow longer for their journey. There will be a phased reopening of the roads from around midday with all roads expected to be fully reopened by 7pm.
