

# Plan your weekend travel

There are no planned works on the Central, District, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Northern, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, DLR or London Trams. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

## Bakerloo line

## Part closure

**Sunday:** no service between Queen's Park and Harrow & Wealdstone owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will call at: Queen's Park – Kensal Green – Willesden Junction – North Acton (for the Central line) – Harlesden – Stonebridge Park – Wembley Central – North Wembley – Preston Road (for the Metropolitan line and South Kenton station) – Kenton – Harrow & Wealdstone.

## Circle line

## Part closure

**All weekend:** no service between Hammersmith and Tower Hill (via King's Cross St. Pancras) owing to station improvements at Moorgate, Barbican and Liverpool Street, and track replacement work at Farringdon. Use the Hammersmith & City line between Hammersmith and King's Cross St. Pancras. A Circle line service will run every ten minutes between Edgware Road and Barking (via Victoria).

## Hammersmith & City line

## Part closure

**All weekend:** no service between King's Cross St. Pancras and Barking owing to station improvements at Moorgate, Barbican and Liverpool Street, and track replacement work at Farringdon. Use alternative Tube and/or bus services.

## Metropolitan line

## Part closure

**All weekend:** no service between King's Cross St. Pancras and Aldgate owing to station improvements at Moorgate, Barbican and Liverpool Street, and track replacement work at Farringdon. Use alternative Tube and/or bus services.

## Better bus information

A NEW digital sign, currently being trialled by TfL, is displaying live arrival times of all bus services using the stop, not just its own.

The pilot scheme started this week at Northwood station, west London, on a route used by people travelling to and from a local hospital.

The new display screen is battery-powered and attaches to the bus stop flag, making it cheaper and easier to install than traditional digital signs which need an electrical power supply. It also means it can be put up at any stop, not just those with bus shelters. If successful, the screens could be used at other locations.



## London Overground

## Part closure

### Highbury & Islington to New Cross/Clapham Junction/Crystal Palace/West Croydon route

**Sunday:** no service between Wandsworth Road and Clapham Junction until 10.15am owing to Network Rail track work. Trains will run along an alternative route to/from Battersea Park, instead of Clapham Junction. Use local buses via all reasonable routes between Clapham Junction and Battersea Park/Surrey Quays, or Southern services between Battersea Park and Clapham Junction.

**Sunday:** no service between Sydenham and Crystal Palace owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run between Balham and West Croydon.

### Gospel to Barking route

**Until February 2017:** no service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail work to enable new, longer trains to run from 2018. Replacement buses will run:

Service J: Gospel Oak (bus stops in Highgate Road) – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill (bus stops in Hornsey Road) – Finsbury Park (Tube) – Harringay Green Lanes – Seven Sisters (for South Tottenham).

Service T: Walthamstow Central – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road (bus stops at Harrow Green) – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – East Ham (Tube) – Barking.

At East Ham, eastbound buses will set down only and westbound buses will pick up only. Use local buses between South Tottenham and Walthamstow Queen's Road. Use Tube services between Finsbury Park and Walthamstow Central, and between East Ham and Barking.

### Watford Junction to Euston route

**Sunday:** no service between Watford Junction and Euston owing to Network Rail signalling work. Replacement buses will run:

Service H: Watford Junction – Watford High Street – Bushey – Carpenders Park – Hatch End – Headstone Lane – Harrow & Wealdstone.

Service A: Harrow & Wealdstone – Kenton – Preston Road (for South Kenton) – North Wembley – Wembley Central – Stonebridge Park – Harlesden – North Acton (Tube) – Willesden Junction – Kensal Green – Queen's Park.

Service B: Wembley Central – Stonebridge Park – Harlesden – Willesden Junction – North Acton (Tube) – Kensal Green – Queen's Park.

Use local bus or Tube services between Queen's Park and Euston via all reasonable routes (entrance/exit at Queen's Park, Kilburn Park, Euston Square and Euston stations only).

### Romford to Upminster route

**All weekend:** no service between Romford and Upminster owing to Crossrail and Network Rail infrastructure work. Use local buses via all reasonable routes.

## TfL Rail

## Part closure

**All weekend:** on Saturday, no service between Chadwell Heath and Shenfield. Replacement buses will call at all stops. On Sunday, the closure will extend to Stratford. This is owing to Crossrail construction work and Network Rail carrying out track and station improvements. Replacement buses will run:

Service C: Romford – Chadwell Heath – Goodmayes – Seven Kings – Ilford – Manor Park – Forest Gate – Stratford.

Service D: Shenfield – Brentwood – Harold Wood – Gidea Park – Romford – Chadwell Heath – Newbury Park (for the Central line).

## Elizabeth line on track

SINCE September 17, weekend track closures on TfL Rail have enabled Network Rail to carry out construction work for the Elizabeth line, including:

- A new roof on the footbridge at Gidea Park
- Removal of the remaining section of the old footbridge at Harold Wood
- Continued demolition of the existing stairs to all platforms at Forest Gate

During the closures, TfL has also taken the opportunity to install a temporary footbridge at Manor Park and begin demolition of the existing footbridge to make way for new lifts.

All of these works are being carried out to provide step-free access and refurbish stations ahead of Elizabeth line services beginning from late 2018.
