## ALL ABOARD DLR DISCOVERY SPECIAL SUMMER SERVICES

LONDONERS and visitors to the capital can enjoy a new experience on the DLR this summer, as TfL and its operator KeolisAmey Docklands launch the DLR Discovery.

Ticket holders can take a guided tour on a non-stopping train between two of London's most iconic destinations – Tower Gateway and Cutty Sark – and gain insight into a historically fascinating area of east London.

The DLR is a unique way to see how this part of the capital has grown and developed over the last 100 years, and locals and visitors are encouraged to explore more of the area they live and work in, or pass through every day.

A tour guide will entertain and inform passengers as they wind their way past the towering skyline of London's financial hub. The tour will then pass the futuristic Crossrail Place and Roof Garden above the newly-built Canary Wharf Elizabeth line station.

The tour also takes in Billingsgate Fish Market, Limehouse Basin and its network of canals, and the Cutty Sark tea clipper.

The journey continues with an insightful 30-minute walking tour around the historic heart of Greenwich, starting and finishing at Cutty Sark DLR station.

Tours start on August 4 and run every Saturday and Sunday until September 9. The special trains will depart on the hour every hour, from 10am each day. The last tour each day will leave Tower Gateway DLR station at 5pm.

DLR's general manager, Trish Ashton, said: 'DLR Discovery tours are an exciting addition to our services and a perfect day out for families, visitors and locals alike.'
