

That's the ticket!

A new combined ticket gives three exciting ways to travel around the capital.

LONDONERS and visitors can now enjoy an all-day ticket that offers a scenic boat trip, a ride on a bike, and a flight on the cable car.

The Explore London combined ticket will save customers 20 per cent on what they would pay if they bought the tickets individually. It costs £25 and reduces to £16.70 for the Explore London joint ticket, which includes a boat ride on MBNA Thames Clippers and bike hire from Santander Cycles.

Leon Daniels, TfL's managing director of surface transport, said: 'The Explore London



ticket combines three superb ways to travel around the city and enjoy the sights, all at a discounted price.

'Whether you're a visitor to the city or a Londoner you'll enjoy a high-speed trip along the River Thames, a relaxing ride on a Santander Cycle and the breathtaking views from the Emirates Air Line cable car.'

The Explore London tickets are available from the MBNA Thames Clippers site for the next six months.

- An Emirates Air Line cable car Discovery Experience ticket, which includes a round-trip, in-flight guide and free entry to the Emirates Aviation Experience exhibition
- An all-day, hop-on, hop-off, MBNA Thames Clippers River Roamer ticket
- A Santander Cycles promo code which gives you unlimited rides of up to 30 minutes for 24 hours
- Every bike journey up to 30 minutes is free. Longer journeys cost an extra £2 for each additional 30 minutes

Have your say on Camden Town station

PLANS to treble the size of Camden Tube station are under consultation.

The upgrade proposed would create a much larger station with a new entrance on Buck Street and three new escalators. The changes would ease crowding and improve access for disabled people with new, step-free access from street to trains.

More than 30million customers use the station each year, with the number set to increase by 40 per cent by 2021, making Camden Town one of the busiest interchanges on the Underground. Crowd control measures, such as making the station exit only, are regularly used to ease congestion.

Managing director of London Underground, Mark Wild, said:

'Upgrading Camden Town Tube station will improve journeys for the tens of thousands of customers who use the station every day.'

'The first consultation we held demonstrated overwhelming support for a station upgrade and we are now seeking views on our more detailed plans.'

In the first public consultation, 95 per cent of respondents agreed that the station needed to be upgraded.
