

# Travel information for today's DLR strike

**DLR services will continue to be disrupted until late tomorrow morning owing to strike action called by the RMT union.**

NO DLR services are likely to run during the 48-hour strike, which started yesterday morning.

## Getting around

Extra buses will run on bus routes that operate along the DLR network and TfL

staff will be available to help customers plan their journeys.

All other TfL services that connect to the DLR network will run as usual.

While the strike continues, the Jubilee, Central, District and Hammersmith & City lines in East London, and London Overground between Highbury and Surrey Quays, will be busier than usual. Stations that interchange with the DLR and other key stations on the network – Canning Town, Bank, Stratford, Canary Wharf, Canada Water, West Ham and Shadwell – will be exceptionally busy.

## Paying for travel

Passengers with Travelcard season tickets will be able to use them on alternative services within their zone as normal, but people travelling outside their zones will be charged the pay as you go fare. Valid travel tickets will also be accepted on the Emirates



Air Line cable car, running between 6am and 10pm today.

Single/return DLR tickets bought today will be accepted on alternative bus routes to allow people to complete their journeys, but will not be valid on Tube or rail services.

Pay as you go with an Oyster or contactless payment card can be used on all TfL services.

# Taxis are the people's favourite

LONDON'S black cab has been voted the top transport Design Icon in the capital following a public poll.

The world famous taxi beat Frank Pick, whose ground-breaking work introduced the legendary posters to the Tube, and Harry Beck's celebrated Tube map. They were among 100 London transport symbols shortlisted in the 'Design Icons' competition, organised by TfL and London Transport Museum.

More than 10,000 people voted in the poll which was sponsored by Exterion Media and part of 'Transported by Design', an 18-month programme of events, exhibitions and competitions that celebrate the role of good design on the capital's transport network.

Lanes closed around St Margaret Street and Broad Sanctuary for Cycle Superhighway works.
